The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jerry Garrett. Minutes of the June 7 meeting were approved as written.

Ordinance No. 90-426, an ordinance of the City of Goodlettsville adopting a budget and establishing a property tax rate for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, through June 30, 1991. Third reading. Motion by Filson to pass on third reading. Seconded by Garrett. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 90-427, an ordinance requiring the display of street numbers on all improved properties within the City of Goodlettsville. Third reading. Motion by Long to pass on third reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 90-428, an ordinance to amend Title 10, Chapter 2, of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code, specifically Section 10-214, by deleting subparagraph (d), and by deleting Section 10-215 in its entirety. Third reading. Motion by Childers to pass on third reading. Seconded by Long. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 90-429, an ordinance to require residential and commercial property owners to be responsible for repair of their sewer service lines. Third reading. The City Manager and Public Works Director requested that third reading be deferred until a legal opinion is received from MTAS concerning City workers going on private property to make repairs. Motion by Filson to defer. Seconded by Long. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 90-430, an ordinance to impose a hotel/motel tax for the City of Goodlettsville. Second reading. Motion by Filson to pass on second reading. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 90-431, an ordinance to direct the Davidson County Election Commission to call an election to fill the terms of two (2) Commissioners of the City of Goodlettsville for October 4, 1990. Second reading. Motion by Long to pass on second reading. Seconded by Garrett. Passed unanimously.

Consider recommendation of the Planning & Zoning Board for approval of a resolution to accept public improvements for Charleston Square Subdivision, Section 4. Motion by Garrett to adopt Resolution No. R90-107. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

Consider an ordinance to amend Chapter 10, Section 1-1001 of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code concerning business dealings of City personnel

with the City. Motion by Long to pass Ordinance No. 90-432 on caption on first reading. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

Consider a resolution with regard to a Medicare Supplement Program for retired City employees through the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System. Motion by Garrett to adopt Resolution No. R90-108. Seconded by Filson. Passed unanimously.

The Police Department requested the following transfers of funds to help outfit the new command center bus: \$2000 from Legal Advisor (421,17); \$2000 from Court Overtime (421,26); \$2000 from Uniform Allowance (421,57); \$500 from Training (421,40); \$6300 to Supplies (421,50); \$200 to Telephone (421,51). Motion by Garrett to approve the transfers. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 90-429, an ordinance to require residential and commercial property owners to be responsible for repair of their sewer service lines. Third reading. The City Attorney requested that third reading be deferred until a legal opinion received from MTAS concerning City workers going on private property can be reviewed further. Motion by Long to defer. Seconded by Filson. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 90-430, an ordinance to levy a privilege tax upon the privilege of occupancy in hotels and motels, to regulate collection of the tax, and to provide for the application of the tax revenue, and providing for an effective date of operation of the ordinance. Third reading. Motion by Filson to pass on third reading. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.
