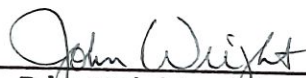


Eddie Galbreath spoke to the commission as a representative of several businesses along Main Street. He wanted the commission to be aware that Dickerson Road is getting the reputation of being a speed trap and that people are avoiding traveling through the downtown area. The result is that business is being adversely affected. The Mayor stated that the matter would be considered.

Hal Smith, a resident of Jackson Road next to Moss-Wright Park, complained about noise, smoke, lights, late hours, lack of a fence, and drainage problems caused by the park. He requested that a fence be erected between his property and the park. The Mayor stated that the City Manager and Park Director would meet with him to discuss the problems and work out solutions.

Public Works Director Bill Martin reported that the low bidder for installation of new traffic signals on Main Street at Long Hollow Pike and Memorial Drive was Stansell Electric and that the bid came in under budget. He recommended that the contract be awarded to Stansell Electric.

The meeting adjourned at 7:22pm.

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Ron Filson. Minutes of the March 15 meeting were approved as written.

Ordinance No. 90-423, an ordinance to amend Title 11, Chapter 15, Section 11-502(b) of the Municipal Code (Ordinance No. 89-413) to rezone Parcels 69 and 70, Davidson County Tax Map 18-16, from R7 (High Density Residential) to CPUD (Commercial Planned Unit Development); parcels to be included in the Goodlettsville Commons shopping center development on North Dickerson Road. Third reading. Motion by Long to pass on third reading. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously on third reading.

Ordinance No. 90-425, an ordinance to amend Title 11, Chapters 6, 9, 11, and 14 of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code (Ordinance No. 89-413), as amended, by changing, adding, and deleting various provisions of the zoning ordinance. Second reading and public hearing. The Planning Director summarized the proposed changes. During the public hearing no one spoke for or against the ordinance and the Mayor declared the public hearing closed. Motion by Childers to pass on second reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed unanimously on second reading.

Consider a resolution to amend the Personnel Policies & Procedures Manual and Handbook adopted July 7, 1988, by Resolution No. 88-7-7-A. Motion by Filson to adopt the amendments as Change 1 of the manual. Seconded by Childers. Resolution No. R90-103 adopted unanimously.

Consider a resolution requesting Madison Suburban Utility District to increase the amount of deposit for commercial sewer service. Deferred to next meeting.

Consider request to transfer funds. The City Recorder requested that the following funds transfers be made: \$300 from Office Supplies (419,50) to Tax Statements (415,55); \$1000 from Park Salaries (447,20) to Park Water (447,62); \$1500 from Park Salaries (447,20) to Park Gas (447,63). Motion by Long to approve the transfers. Seconded by Filson. Passed unanimously.

Public Works Director Bill Martin reported that the low bid on the Main Street traffic light upgrade project was \$33,104 by Stansell Electric and that the low bid on the sewer repair project was \$78,000 by Madison Contractors. Motion by Filson to award the contracts to the low bidders. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

Martin also requested the approval of the purchase of two sewer flow meters at a cost of \$20,000 each. Motion by Filson to approve the purchase. Seconded by Long. Passed unanimously.

Long requested permission to invite a speaker to the next commission meeting to present a program for regional recycling. It was agreed that the speaker would be on the agenda for the next meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 6:54pm.
