Mayor Duncan called the meeting to order. Mayor Duncan offered prayer and led the chambers in the pledge of allegiance.

City Recorder Allison Baker called the roll: Mayor Duncan present, Vice Mayor Tinnin present, Commissioner Anderson present, Commissioner Bell present, and Commissioner Young present.

Consider minutes of the March 14, 2019 regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners. Vice Mayor Tinnin made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion and motion passed 5-0.

City Manager Tim Ellis welcomed City Recorder Allison Baker back and thanked Elizabeth Simpson, Mary Laine Hucks, and Julie High for filling in during her absence. He also announced the Community Cleanup Day on April 13th for free drop off during that time at Public Works as well as a shredding event from 9:00am-12:00pm.

Mayor Duncan welcomed Commissioner Anderson back after being under the weather.

Consider new business.

Consider Ordinance 19-935, an ordinance amending the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 13, Chapter 3, Section 311 by creating a subsection 1 in regards to vehicular sight distance, first reading. Vice Mayor Tinnin made a motion to consider Ordinance 19-935. Commissioner Bell seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 5-0 vote to approve Ordinance 19-935.

Consider Ordinance 19-936, an ordinance amending the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 11, Chapter 7, Section 706 by deleting Section 706 in its entirety, as it relates to hotel registrations, first reading. Commissioner Young made a motion to consider Ordinance 19-936. Vice Mayor Tinnin seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 5-0 vote to approve Ordinance 19-936.

Consider Resolution 19-842, a resolution declaring certain property surplus to the needs of the City of Goodlettsville and calling for its disposal by online auction or any other reasonable manner. City Manager Ellis would like to recommend donating the six sets of aluminum bleachers on the list to the Goodlettsville Middle School to be used at their football stadium.

Commissioner Bell made a motion to consider Resolution 19-842. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 5-0 vote to approve Resolution 19-842.

Consider Resolution 19-843, a resolution acknowledging the City of Goodlettsville's participation in the Metropolitan Nashville-Davidson County Hazard Mitigation Plan by Memorandum of Agreement. Commissioner Young made a motion to consider Resolution 19-843. Vice Mayor Tinnin seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 5-0 vote to approve Resolution 19-843.

Consider Resolution 19-844, a resolution honoring Mr. Xavier Kendall for winning the Vanderbilt University's Martin Luther King Essay Contest and Resolution 19-845, a resolution honoring Mr. Joshua Widener for being the first runner-up in the Vanderbilt University Martin Luther King Essay Contest. City Manager Ellis then read the resolution:

WHEREAS, Vanderbilt University Office of the University Chaplain and Religious Life recently conducted an essay and poetry contest for Middle School and High School students; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Xavier Kendall's great accomplishment deserves boundless recognition from the City of Goodlettsville.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE, TENNESSEE RECOGNIZES AND HONORS MR. XAVIER KENDALL FOR WINNING THE

VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY’S MARTIN LUTHER KING ESSAY AND POETRY CONTEST.
