Minutes:

Mike Kelly, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 6:07pm.

A quorum was established.

Approval of Minutes

After a review of the minutes from the November 23rd meeting, a motion was made to approve the minutes by Stuart Huffman.

Reports from Staff: Reports were given by Superintendent of Recreation Jennifer Spillers and Superintendent of Parks Jack Presley.

Unfinished Business

LPRF/Rachel's Garden Playground: We're still waiting to sign contracts. The fire department has continued to raise funds. 1.1 million dollars has been raised. Met with playground design group, there are new equipment possibilities. We can't break ground until we sign contracts with TDEC.

Pickleball Courts: Capital money is being used to renovate our courts. Jack Presley said posts are set for the courts, they'll be out drilling and setting an inch and a half higher. PRI will do crack filling, which is all weather dependent. Rodgers group will do paving, estimated in May. Putting out a bid to have the courts painted.

Lori Cordell raised concerns about why we aren't doing more to expand our pickleball options. The concern is that we're falling behind other cities in our offerings. If we expand our courts, then we would be able to host tournaments which could help pay for itself.

Sarah Jennings brought out that with the renovations of the tennis courts, with doing a lot of the work in house, we could only afford to renovate one court at this time.

Tim Ellis said he is recommending funding to redo the lower courts in next year's budget.

Volleyball Courts: Sarah Jennings said we will have C2 Volleyball come and speak with us in the future. We are looking to have more volleyball courts added to Moss Wright Park in order

to be able to host tournaments.

Tim Ellis said he will propose that funding come out of tourism budget for the new construction of the new volleyball courts.

Stuart Huffman noted that four courts is ideal for tournaments, six would allow for larger tournaments.

New Business

Summer Aquatics Update: Jennifer Spillers let the group know that we've reached out to 26 outlets, and tried to host a life guard job fair, with zero interest. We have only 1 applicant that has applied. We're struggling to compete since we don't offer enough incentives compared to other job opportunities that are out there.

Tim Ellis said if the city wants to stay in aquatic business then the city may need to look at if an indoor facility would be beneficial. Right now it's almost costing more to the city to open the pool for two months verses year round.

Sarah Jennings said we will open the splash pad early if the weather is favorable.

Tim Ellis said a conceptual study was done about 10 years ago looking at the cost of building an indoor pool facility. Tim said he would look to see if he still had that study and what the cost would approximately be given inflation.

Comments from Board Members & Staff: Mike Kelly let everyone know that Saturday is opening ceremonies for baseball and invited all to attend. Tim Ellis thanked the staff for their hard work over the past few months while the parks director was on leave.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 6:57pm.
