Approval of Minutes

After a review of the minutes from the July 26, 2022 meeting, a motion was made to approve the minutes by Glen Garrett.

Reports from Staff – A report was given by the director, Sarah Jennings, regarding current programming and developments in the parks.

Unfinished Business

LPRF/Rachel's Garden Playground: We are contracted with the State of TN and the board of commissioners have approved the contract. We have also received approval from the commission for the architect and admin. We are now waiting on final approval from the state. We will move forward as soon as we get the go ahead.

Pickleball Courts: New fencing is being completed right now on the courts. The upper courts are already fenced, lower court fencing is happening now. Hoping to have the fencing completed by the end of next week. Once the coating goes down, then we'll be able to put the nets up. The coating contractors are looking to get us in earlier if possible. When completed, we'll have three pickleball courts on top, and the lower court will be multipurpose. There will be two tennis courts that can be converted to four pickleball courts. This will meet the requirements for tournaments.

Aquatics: Originally, Kimley Horn was supposed to be here tonight to talk about what an indoor facility would look like. We received ARPA funds for an aquatic feasibility study, hoping to have the study done prior to the November parks board meeting. The splash pad is open through the second week of October. We've enjoyed a very successful season. Not using as many chemicals right now as the weather cools off. The maintenance department is doing a great job keeping it running and responding to issues.

Volleyball Courts: Funding in capital budget for volleyball courts at Moss Wright park. Currently, we have a bid out for 850 tons of sand that we'll need brought in for the four courts. This week we'll have a bid out for the installation. We'll buy all the materials and then have a company install it for us. Courts will be sized for recreation or competitive play. The plan is to have volleyball courts completed by the end of November. We hope to be able to host tournaments and continue to grow the sport of volleyball in Goodlettsville.

New Business

ARPA Funding (Parks and Recreation)

- Aquatics Feasibility Study- Bid is out right now for proposals, which closes on October 7th. Looking to determine what it would cost to construct, staff, and maintain. Should have someone secured to come to next meeting.
- Shade at Quad- We will be adding shade structures to three out of four fields. The shade structures will be delivered in January and they will be installed ahead of the spring season. We will also add pavement to the quad to help with drainage.
- Fencing at Peay Park Courts- Part of ARPA money to replace fencing. We will have a grand reopening of the courts once they're completed.
- Shelter at Peay Park- Will be placed near splash pad, and service both Rachel's garden and the splash pad. The shelter will be 60x60, the same size as shelter 3 at Moss Wright park. It will have a capacity limit of 100 people once we have the benches in. This will be a great resource for our community that we anticipate being heavily utilized.
- License Plate Readers at Park Entrances- Police is working on the coordination of adding these to Moss Wright, Pleasant Green and Peay Park. This will be an added tool to help with fighting crime in the park and hope it will act as a deterrent.
- Message Board Signs- Previously only had one working sign, now have four total in the city that we can utilize for special events or to help direct traffic.
