Minutes:

Present: Jennifer Duncan, Stuart Huffman, and Rusty Tinnin.

Absent: Jimmy D. Anderson and Zach Young.

Also Present: Russell Freeman, Tim Ellis, Allison Baker, Sarah Jennings, Addam McCormick, Gary Goodwin, Kimberly Lynn, Ken Reeves, and Mike Bauer.

Mayor Rusty Tinnin called the meeting to order. Rick Sturgis offered prayer and Mayor Rusty Tinnin led the chambers in the pledge of allegiance.

City Recorder Allison Baker called the roll: Mayor Rusty Tinnin present, Vice Mayor Duncan present, Commissioner Anderson absent, Commissioner Huffman present, Commissioner Young absent.

Consider the minutes of the July 22, 2021 regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners. Vice Mayor Duncan made a motion to consider the minutes as written. Commissioner Huffman seconded the motion and the motion passed 3-0.

City Manager Tim Ellis announced the beautification program the city has started and is partnering with the Goodlettsville Chamber on, Looking GOOD. It will award a business and residence in Goodlettsville that is Looking GOOD once per month for their beautification efforts. He also announced that Emily Drive will be closed beginning Monday to replace a large drainage tile. He advertised on October 30th the city will host a household hazardous waste drop off at the Visitor's Center. Halloween on the Park will be held on Saturday, October 23rd from 1:00pm-3:00pm and the last Music on Main will be held on Thursday, September 2nd at 6:30pm at City Hall.

City Manager Ellis also talked about the tragic flooding in Waverly and the efforts Toby Swager has put forth in gathering supplies as well as carrying 40,000 pounds of ice in a truck that Tyson has donated to be taken to Humphreys County and left for two weeks. Reddy Ice provided the ice and CRC has helped. This is a significant thing for a local person to coordinate and take on.

Vice Mayor Duncan stated Toby does awesome work. Commissioner Huffman seconded that point.

Mayor Rusty Tinnin asked we remember Mayor Duncan and his family in their prayers.

Consider Old Business.

Consider Ordinance 21-1003, an ordinance adopting the State Certified tax rates for the City of Goodlettsville for the fiscal year July 1, 2021, thru June 30, 2022, second reading. City Manager Ellis stated this would set the tax rate in Davidson County as \$.7222 and in Sumner County \$.8066. Commissioner Huffman made a motion to consider Ordinance 21-1003. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Commissioner Huffman asked if moving forward there could be separate ordinances for each county. City Manager Ellis stated he thought we could do it in separate ordinances but would still refer to the State's certified rate. There was additional discussion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Ordinance 21-1003.

Consider Ordinance 21-1006, an ordinance to amend the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 11, Chapter 5, Section 501, Subsection 1 by deleting subsection 1 in its entirety and replacing it with a new subsection 1 as it relates to weapons and firearms, second reading. City Manager Ellis stated this aligns our Municipal Code with the most recent Tennessee Code and the Open Carry Law that was recently passed. Commissioner Huffman made a motion to consider Ordinance 21-1006. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Ordinance 21-1006.

Consider New Business.

Consider Ordinance 21-1007, an ordinance to amend the Zoning Ordinance to define fence material and location requirements, first reading. Planning Director Addam McCormick stated they received a request for some chain link fencing in a front yard and we didn't have a lot on fencing so this sets up the requirements for commercial and residential. There was additional discussion. We did not eliminate chain link fencing just put in some minimum requirements. The goal is to have nice quality-looking fences in the residential areas. There was additional discussion. Vice Mayor Duncan made a motion to consider Ordinance 21-1007. Commissioner Huffman seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Ordinance 21-1007.

Consider Ordinance 21-1008, an ordinance to amend the Zoning Ordinance to define minimum interior building dimensions for required one and two car garages, first reading. City Manager Ellis stated this establishes minimum square footage in the length and width of garages. Commissioner Huffman made a motion to consider Ordinance 21-1008. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vice Mayor Duncan asked if people do not currently meet this requirement if they are grandfathered in. City Manager Ellis confirmed this. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Ordinance 21-1008.

Consider Ordinance 21-1009, an ordinance to amend the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 14, Chapter 1, Section 101 by reducing the number of members of the Goodlettsville Regional Planning Commission from eleven (11) to nine (9), first reading. City Manager Ellis stated recently we had one member resign and one member pass away. We probably have the largest Planning Commission in the state of Tennessee. The Planning Commission will have to consider this at their next meeting. There is a possibility that City Manager Ellis will ask for an amendment to further reduce this number. Vice Mayor Duncan made a motion to consider Ordinance 21-1009. Commissioner Huffman seconded the motion. Commissioner Huffman asked if we reduced again if it would be to seven members. City Manager Ellis stated yes, his

recommendation would be to go to seven members. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Ordinance 21-1009.

Consider Ordinance 21-1010, an ordinance to amend the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 9, Chapter 2, Section 204, Subsection (4) by reducing the fee for a Peddler Permit from one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to fifty dollars (\$50.00) in accordance to the Tennessee Code Annotated, first reading. City Manager Ellis stated we recently discovered that by state statute the most that can be charged is \$50.00 so this aligns with that statute. Vice Mayor Duncan made a motion to consider Ordinance 21-1010. Commissioner Huffman seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Ordinance 21-1010.

Consider Ordinance 21-1011, an ordinance to amend Ordinance 13-792, being an ordinance to amend Title 12, Chapter 1, of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code, being the Standard Building Code for the City of Goodlettsville, first reading. City Manager Ellis stated this would adopt the 2018 version of the International Building Code, International Residential Code, International Fuel Gas Code, International Mechanical Code, International Plumbing Code, International Existing Building Code, International Property Maintenance Code, International Energy Conservation Code and the ICC/ANSI A117.1 2017 Standard on Accessible and Usable Buildings and Facilities. Commissioner Huffman made a motion to consider Ordinance 21-1011. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Ordinance 21-1011.

Consider Ordinance 21-1012, an ordinance to amend the Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 7, Chapter 1 & 2 as it relates to Fire Protection, first reading. City Manager Ellis stated this adopts the 2018 International Fire Code. Commissioner Huffman made a motion to consider Ordinance 21-1012. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Ordinance 21-1012.

Consider Resolution 21-998, a resolution acknowledging an application for a grant with KABOOM! for the purchase, technical design and support in constructing a play structure. City Manager Ellis stated we are asking for \$100,000 and it is 100% grant funded with no matching funds needed. Commissioner Huffman made a motion to consider Resolution 21-998. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vice Mayor Duncan asked where this would be located. Parks Director Sarah Jennings stated it would be located in Brooks Park. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Resolution 21-998.

Consider Resolution 21-999, a resolution to approve an Employee Leave COVID Vaccination Incentive Program for those employees who choose to be vaccinated against the COVID-19 Virus. City Manager Ellis stated as we all know we are having a surge in COVID issues currently. This does not take anyone's vacation away or penalize an employee. This is only an incentive for those employees that have received the COVID vaccination. Vice Mayor Duncan stated she has been vaccinated so she is not against this but has a couple of questions she needs to look into a little bit more. Vice Mayor Duncan made a motion to defer Resolution 21-999. Commissioner Huffman seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to defer Resolution 21-999. City Manager Ellis stated it will be deferred until the next meeting and it would need to be amended as there was a deadline of October 1st in the Resolution.

Consider Resolution 21-1000, a resolution to approve a data sharing memorandum of Understanding between the City of Goodlettsville and Flock Group, LLC. as it relates to Flock's Technology Platform. City Manager Ellis stated we have a local residential community that has purchased a license plate reader and in order for our Police Department to have access to that data we must enter into this Memorandum of Understanding. Commissioner Huffman made a motion to consider Resolution 21-1000. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Resolution 21-1000.

Consider Resolution 21-1001, a resolution acknowledging the application for the Blue Cross Blue Shield Foundation's Healthy Places Grant. City Manager Ellis stated this grant is for an amount not to exceed \$1,200,000.00 for the redevelopment of Peay Park and this grant is fully funded and does not require a city match. Vice Mayor Duncan made a motion to consider Resolution 21-1001. Commissioner Huffman seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Resolution 21-1001.

Consider Resolution 21-1002, a resolution approving a contract between the City of Goodlettsville and the Tennessee Department of Tourism for the purpose of marketing tourism. Commissioner Huffman made a motion to consider Resolution 21-1002. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Resolution 21-1002.

Consider Resolution 21-1003, a resolution of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Goodlettsville, Tennessee, authorizing the procurement method of competitive sealed proposals in procuring vending services and supplies. City Manager Ellis stated our current contract with Coca-Cola is set to expire next year. There was additional discussion. This resolution is to approve this procurement method. Vice Mayor Duncan made a motion to consider Resolution 21-1003. Commissioner Huffman seconded the motion. Mayor Tinnin asked how long the contract would be for. City Manager Ellis stated it is a 3 year agreement. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Resolution 21-1003.

Consider Resolution 21-1004, a resolution approving the City of Goodlettsville Employee Service Recognition Program. City Manager Ellis stated this would recognize employees on their fifth year anniversary and going forward. This would cost the city no more than \$2,000 annually. Commissioner Huffman made a motion to consider Resolution 21-1004. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Resolution 21-1004.

Consider Resolution 21-1005, a resolution to approve the capital expenditure for the purchase of a new pick-up truck with a camper topper and slide out tray. City Manager Ellis stated the current price is \$39,766.00 on state contract and would be paid for out of the fleet fund. This was not included in the FY 22 budget. Our rescue truck at two years old has 72,000 miles. This would alleviate a lot of those miles to utilize this for medical calls. Commissioner Huffman made a motion to consider Resolution 21-1005. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Resolution 21-1005.

Consider Resolution 21-1006, a resolution to ratify and approve the issuance of an emergency purchase order for HVAC system at the Mansker's Station Visitor Center. Vice Mayor Duncan

made a motion to consider Resolution 21-1006. Commissioner Huffman seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 3-0 vote to approve Resolution 21-1006.

With no further business, Vice Mayor Duncan made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Huffman seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at approximately 7:09 with a 3-0 vote.

SUMMARY STATEMENT:

An ordinance to amend the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 15, Chapter 1, Section 114 by creating a new Subsection (4) as it relates to vehicle noise.

15-114. Mufflers, prevention of noise. (1) It shall be unlawful to operate any motor vehicle at any time unless equipped with a muffler in good working order and in constant operation to prevent excessive or unusual noise, and no person shall use a muffler cut out bypass or similar device upon a vehicle on a highway, within the City of Goodlettsville.

(2) It shall be unlawful to operate the engine and power mechanism of every motor vehicle unless equipped and adjusted as to prevent the escape of excessive fumes or smoke.

(3) It shall be unlawful for any person to cause unnecessary motor vehicle noise by sounding his horn other than in an emergency situation, "racing" the engine of the motor vehicle or otherwise causing excessive engine noise, or by causing the screeching or squealing of the tires of any motor vehicle other than in an emergency situation.

(4) It shall be deemed a violation of Section 114 (1) and (3) when the sound shall be plainly audible at a distance of more than 50 feet from the vehicle.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 15, CHAPTER 1, SECTION 114 BY CREATING A NEW SUBSECTION 4 AS IT RELATES TO VEHICLE NOISE.

WHEREAS, it has been determined there is a need to be define the limits of noises emitted from vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Goodlettsville deems it in the best interest of the to approve an ordinance that would define such limits of noises emitting from vehicles.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE, TENNESSEE THAT THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENTS ARE ADOPTED AS FOLLOWS:

§ Title 15 – Chapter 1 – Section 114 – Subsection (4)

(4) It shall be deemed a violation of Section 114 (1) and (3) when the sound shall be plainly audible at a distance of more than 50 feet from the vehicle.

THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT FIFTEEN (15) DAYS FROM ITS PASSAGE, THE PUBLIC WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS OF GOODLETTSVILLE, TENNESSEE REQUIRING IT.

ORDINANCE NO. 21-1002

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE 8, CHAPTER 2, ENTITLED "BEER" OF THE GOODLETTSVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, TITLE 57, CHAPTER 5, Section 106 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, (T.C.A 57-5-106) authorizes municipalities to pass ordinances governing the issuance of licenses and regulations regarding the storage, sale, manufacture and/or distribution of beer, and

WHEREAS, TITLE 8, CHAPTER 2, entitled "Beer" of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code currently exists to provide such regulations; and

WHEREAS, new establishments, not currently identified in the existing Chapter, wish to sell, manufacture and distribute beer, and new regulations are required to appropriately regulate these uses; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Goodlettsville find it desirable and necessary to the economic development of the City to permit these uses,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE, TENNESSEE, THAT THE ENTIRETY OF TITLE 8, CHAPTER 2 BE REPLACED WITH THE LANGUAGE THAT FOLLOWS.

CHAPTER 2

8-201. Definitions:

BEER

1. *Applicant* shall mean the person on whose behalf an application for beer permit is filed.
2. *Barrel* shall mean thirty-one (31) gallons.
3. *Beer* means beer, ale or other malt beverages, or any other beverages having an alcoholic content as defined in Tennessee Code Annotated §57-5-101(b), and any amendments thereto to become effective in the future; provided, however, that no more than forty-nine (49) percent of the overall alcoholic content of such beverage may be derived from the addition of flavors and other non-beverage ingredients containing alcohol.
4. *Beer board* or *board* means that administrative body organized and empowered under the authority of Tennessee Code Annotated §57-5-106.
5. *Certified clerk* shall mean a clerk who has successfully satisfied the training requirements contained in this part, or who has received certification from a responsible vendor training program.
6. *Clerk* shall mean any person working in a capacity to sell beer directly to consumers for off-premise consumption.
7. *Commission* shall mean the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission.
8. *Craft Beer Enterprise* shall mean a craft beer business whose primary business is the retail sale of craft beer.
9. *Craft Beer* shall mean beer manufactured by breweries with an annual production of six million (6,000,000) barrels or less.

10. *Growler* shall mean a refillable rigid glass, plastic, aluminum or stainless steel container with a flip-top or screw-on lid that is no larger than 2 liters (0.5283 gallons) into which craft beer is prefilled, filled or refilled for off-premises consumption.
11. *Hotel/Motel* shall mean any establishment which meets any definition found in Tennessee Code Annotated §57-4-102 (21)
12. *Manufacture* shall mean producing beer at a rate of at least two hundred (200) barrels each calendar year on the licensed premises.
13. *Meals* shall be defined as any of the following:
 - a. Food sold in a heated state or heated by the seller;
 - b. Two (2) or more food ingredients mixed or combined by the seller for sale as a single item.
 - c. Food sold with eating utensils provided by the seller, including plates, knives, forks, spoons, glasses, cups, napkins or straws. A plate does not include a container or packaging used to transport the food; or
 - d. Non-alcoholic beverages, except for beverages sold in unopened containers to be consumed off-premises.
14. *Outdoor Venue* shall mean an outdoor location which does not meet the definition of premises as defined in § 8-201(19). It may or may not be on a separate non-adjacent parcel. It must be appropriately zoned for commercial activity.
15. *Package Retail Sales* shall mean the sale of beer bottled or packaged at the manufacturer's or wholesaler's location and transported to the retail establishments.
16. *Permit* shall mean any permit issued pursuant to this article.
17. *Permittee* shall mean any person to whom any permit has been issued pursuant to this article.
18. *Person* shall mean any private individual, partnership, joint venture, corporation, and any other business entity or association.
19. *Premises* shall mean contiguous property owned, leased, or controlled by the permittee and so connected with the beer business in which the permittee is engaged as to form a component or integral part of it, including, but not limited to, the building and the parking areas surrounding it. Premises includes all decks, patios and other well-defined outdoor serving and consuming areas that are contiguous to the exterior of the building in which the business is located and that are operated by the business identified in the permit. A permit shall be valid for all decks, patios and other well-defined outdoor serving areas that are contiguous to the exterior of the building in which the business is located; that are operated by the business and only for a business operating under the name identified in the permit.
20. *Responsible vendor* shall mean a person, corporation or other entity that has been issued a permit to sell beer and has received certification by the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission under the "Tennessee Responsible Vendor Act of 2006," Tennessee Code Annotated §57-5-601, et seq.
21. *Responsible Vendor Training Program* shall mean a training program related to the responsible sale of beer which has met all the statutory and regulatory requirements set forth in Tennessee Code Annotated §57-5-601 et seq.
22. *Restaurant* shall mean a business establishment whose primary business is the sale of prepared food to be consumed on the premise.
23. *Storage* shall mean the storing or possessing of beer for the purpose of resale by the permit holder.
24. *TABC* shall mean the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission.
25. The pronouns *he*, *him* and *his* shall refer to persons of the female, as well as the male, gender, as applicable.

8-202. Beer board created; powers. A beer board is hereby created for the City of Goodlettsville and named the Goodlettsville Beer Board.

The board shall have such power and authority as set forth in Tennessee Code Annotated, § 57-5-101, et seq. and shall have the absolute authority to issue permits for the sale of beer and to revoke the said permits duly issued for violation of any ordinance of the city or any governmental agency within Davidson County, Tennessee, and Sumner County, Tennessee, or for such cause as the board may consider necessary to promote the public health, morals and safety of the citizens of the City of Goodlettsville, Tennessee.

8-203. Membership, appointment and compensation; removal of members and filling of vacancies. The Goodlettsville Beer Board shall consist of five (5) members who are residents of the City of Goodlettsville, one (1) of whom is a member of the Board of Commissioners to be appointed by the mayor and approved by the board of commissioners. Board members shall serve without compensation. They shall serve for terms of three (3) years. Any vacancy on the board for any reason shall be filled in the same manner as the previous appointment, and the individual so appointed will serve out the unexpired term.

8-204. Issuance of permits by Beer Board.

- a. The Beer Board is vested with full and complete authority to issue permits, which permits shall be issued only for locations which are within a commercially zoned area as indicated on the then current and applicable zoning map at the time the application is made, for the sale, storage, and warehousing of beer for on-premises consumption and off-premises consumption.
- b. The permittee's establishment or place of business for the off-premise retail beer sales shall be located within an appropriate zoning district and open for customers by public access not less than five (5) days per week and eight (8) hours per day.

8-205. Permits for the manufacture of beer.

Permits for the manufacture of craft beer shall be issued in accordance with the general requirements of this chapter. A manufacturer of beer can further apply for permits for retail sale for on-premises and/or off-premises consumption. Documentation by the manufacturer of the number of barrels produced each calendar year may be required.

8-206. Permits for the sale of beer.

There are two (2) types of permits and each type has classes of permits within the type. The two (2) types of permits the Beer Board may issue are:

A retailer's "off-premises" permit shall be issued for the sale of beer only for the consumption off the business premises in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

A retailer's "on-premises" permit shall be issued to any business engaged in the sale of beer where the beer is to be consumed by the purchaser or his guests upon the premises of the seller. A retailer's "on-premises" permit may be issued only for use in connection with these establishments defined in § 8-211 through § 8-220 below.

A business can sell beer for both on-premises and off-premises consumption at the same location if otherwise permitted by law and this ordinance.

If the character of the establishment changes from the classification under which a permit was originally issued, the permittee will be required to obtain a new permit to conform to the type pf establishment being operated by the permittee.

8-207. Permit required for engaging in beer business.

It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to sell, store for sale, distribute for sale or manufacture beer without first making application to and obtaining a permit from the Beer Board pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 57-5-103. The application shall be made on such forms as the Board shall prescribe and/or furnish, and shall be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00). Said fee shall be in the form of cash, cashier's check, or company check made payable to the City. Each person signing an application must be a person of good moral character and certify that he has read and is familiar with the provisions of this chapter. For purposes of this chapter, "entity" means a firm, partnership, Limited Liability Company, corporation, Joint Stock Company, syndicate, association or any other legal entity whatsoever.

8-208. Qualifications for permit.

In order to qualify for a permit to sell beer, an applicant must fully satisfy, comply with and adhere to the following qualifications and criteria for the applicant and location for the sale of beer:

- (a) No sale of such beverages shall be made except in accordance with the permit granted.
- (b) Neither the applicant nor any persons employed or to be employed by the applicant in such distribution or sale of such beverages shall have ever been convicted of any violation of law regarding the prohibition, sale, possession, manufacture, or transportation of intoxicating liquor, or any crime involving moral turpitude within the past ten (10) years.
- (c) The property upon which the business is operating is located in a zoning district approved for such use.
- (d) The applicant shall execute an authorization enabling the City to receive from each and every wholesale supplier to the permittee, the dollar value and amounts of beer sold by the wholesaler or distributor to the permittee, at such time or times as the City may request such information. This authorization shall be in full force and effect during the entire time of the permit.
- (e) The applicant shall not make a false statement in his application for any beer permit. Such a statement shall be cause for immediate revocation of the permit.

8-209. Minimum distance from dwellings, etc.

- (a) No beer permit shall be issued to an applicant whose location is less than one hundred feet (100') from a building containing one to four (1 - 4) residential dwelling units (dwelling), a church, park, a playground, a school, a State of Tennessee licensed day care center (day care center) or a nursery with the exception that there shall be no distance requirement between a permit location and any church, school, day care center or nursery that is established on or after January 1, 2011 that is located within a Core Commercial (CC), Commercial General (CG), Commercial Service (CS), Commercial Service Limited (CSL), Office Professional (OP) or Commercial Core Overlay (CCO) zoning district. The date on which a church, school, day care center or nursery is established will be the date of the certificate of occupancy for new construction or the date of the approved life safety inspection for existing structures.

- (b) In determining the distance from a park or playground, the distance shall be measured in a straight line from the nearest point of the property boundary of the park or playground in a straight line to the center of the nearest main entrance of the applicant's facility. The distance from a dwelling, church, school, day care center and nursery shall be measured in a straight line from the nearest point of the structure of any dwelling, church, school, day care center, nursery or church to the center of the nearest main entrance of the applicant's facility. The applicant may be required to provide the documentation that the distances have been measured and certified by a professional engineer or registered surveyor and recorded on a drawing prepared by the engineer or surveyor and made available to the board at the expense of the applicant.
- (c) The distance from a dwelling and the means and method of measuring such distance provided for herein shall not apply to locations holding permits prior to the adoption of the provisions of this chapter, nor to the renewal of such permits, but shall apply to permits issued after the adoption of the provisions thereof. The distance shall also not apply to an applicant for an on-premises permit whose location is a part of a planned unit development as defined by the Goodlettsville Zoning Ordinance and approved as a part of a master plan which includes residential and community facility activities developed as a planned community. The provisions regarding the distance requirement to licensed day care centers and nurseries shall not apply to permittees holding a permit issued prior to the approval date of the provisions of this chapter and in violation of such provisions; provided renewal of such permits shall only be granted to those permittees as defined in this chapter holding valid permits on the effective date of the provisions of this chapter and to transferees or such permittees, who were operating under valid permits prior to the location of such licensed day care center or nursery within two hundred fifty feet (250') thereof.
- (d) Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to allow the City to revoke, suspend, or deny a permit to a business selling, distributing, or manufacturing beer on the basis of its proximity to a church, school, or other place of public gathering if valid permit has been issued to the business prior to January 1, 1993. However, if beer is not sold at such a business for six (6) continuous months, the protection provided herein ceases to apply.

8-210. Requirements to maintain any permit issued under this Section.

The following requirements shall be met at all times to maintain a permit issued by the City Beer Board.

- a. A permit holder shall not**
 - i) Operate a disorderly place
 - ii) Permit boisterous or disorderly conduct on the premises.
 - iii) Sell or allow to be sold on the premises of the permittee, beer to any person using foodstamps issued pursuant to state or federal law for the purchase of such beer.
- b. Hours and days of operations.** It shall be unlawful to offer for sale or sell beer within the corporate limits of the City between the hours of 3:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. on Sunday and between the hours of 3:00 A.M. and 6:00 A.M. Monday through Saturday.
- c. Sales to minors or intoxicated persons.** It shall be unlawful to sell or offer to sell beer to a person under the age of twenty-one (21) years or to a person who is visibly intoxicated.
- d. Condition of premises generally.** No retailer's permit shall be granted to any person whose premises are not neat, clean and in good repair, both inside and outside. The premises shall at all times be free from litter, weeds, trash and other forms of debris. Any tires, old appliances, motor vehicle parts, tools, equipment or other similar materials shall not be displayed openly on the premises but must be stored inside an opaque enclosure.

- e. **Inspection of beer businesses.** The City Manager, Assistant City Manager, members of the Beer Board and staff authorized by the City Manager shall have the right to inspect at any and all times the entire premises and property where or upon or in which the beverages regulated by this chapter are sold, stored, transported or otherwise dispensed or distributed or handled, whether at retail or wholesale, in the City for any law violations.
- f. **Continually operate the business.** A permit holder must return a permit to the county or city that issued it within fifteen (15) days of termination of the business, change in ownership, relocation of the business or change of the business's name; provided, that notwithstanding the failure to return a beer permit, a permit shall expire on termination of the business, change in ownership, relocation of the business or change of the business's name. Any such establishment for which two (2) consecutive months or for any three (3) months in any calendar year does not meet the established minimums of non-alcoholic sales shall have their permit revoked.
- g. **Properly pay all taxes, fees, and charges.** All property taxes, license fees or other charges owed by the permittee, or by the owners of the permittee, to the City or Davidson or Sumner County, Tennessee, must be kept current throughout the term of the license. This requirement shall not apply to the owners of a permittee that is a publicly held company.
- h. **Maintain property in compliance with all State, County, and City regulatory requirements.** The premises upon which the permit is granted shall at all times be in compliance with City zoning ordinances, and with all fire, health, safety and building codes of the City and/or the State of Tennessee.

8-211. Failure to maintain requirements.

Failure on the part of any permittee to observe the requirements of this chapter after issuance of a permit shall constitute grounds for suspension or revocation of the permit.

8-212. On-Premise Consumption Permits Defined.

The following classes of permits for on-premises consumption are established.

1. Restaurant
2. Craft Beer Establishment
3. Hotel/Motel
4. Caterer
5. Golf Course
6. Special Venue

Definitions for each of the classes are established in the section dedicated to the requirements and restrictions of each class.

8-213. Classification of existing permits.

All beer permits now issued and outstanding will be classified and placed in its appropriate category, and the holders of said beer permits shall be so notified, along with a copy of this ordinance.

8-214. Restaurant Classification Requirement and Restrictions.

- a. An establishment must meet the restaurant requirements of Tennessee Code Annotated § 57-4-102 (21).
- b. In the event that a restaurant contains a bar or bar area, food service shall be equally available to the bar and bar area as it is in other areas of the restaurant.

- c. An establishment shall be eligible for a permit as a restaurant only if more than fifty percent (50%) of the gross revenue of the restaurant is generated from the serving of meals. Any such establishment for which two (2) consecutive months or for any three (3) months in any calendaryear has fifty percent (50%) or less of its gross revenue from the serving of meals shall have its beer permit revoked. Each permit holder is to submit annually the individual gross sales of both meals and beer prior to the permit being renewed. If it is determined an independent audit of said records should occur the permit holder is to provide all necessary records. If a permit holder fails to provide such records then their on-premise beer permit shall automatically be revoked.
- d. Have a minimum of eighty (80) seats in which eighty percent (80%) must be in the interior of thebuilding under a permanent roof and enclosed on all sides. The remaining twenty percent (20%)may be in an open air or patio area as permitted by subsection (e). Seats are to be counted by individual chairs or in the use of bench seats, twenty-two inches (22") would equal one (1) seat.Bench seats should not protrude past table edges. In case of any outdoor seating, the outdoor seating area must be accessible from the inside of the restaurant or eating place and the outdoor seating area must have some type of permanent enclosure around it, such as a wall or fencing. All table and chair locations are to meet all building, fire and life safety codes and regulations.
- e. A permittee having this category of license shall be allowed to sell and serve on a patio or open air area, for which access is provided only by going through the interior of the building. The patio or open air area shall be enclosed by a permanent fence, railing, or similar structure, a minimum of forty-two inches (42") in height, which obstructs normal walking access to the patioor open air area, except by entry through the interior of the building. The fence, railing, or otherstructure shall have at least one (1) emergency exit, to be opened only in the event of an emergency and so marked, which will emit an audible sound, such as a bell, siren or other like sound, when the emergency exit is opened. Additional such exits may be required depending onthe size of the fenced area, as specified in the Goodlettsville Fire Protection Ordinance.
- f. Within thirty (30) minutes from the time that sale of beer has ceased as required by§ 8-210(b), all containers, glasses or other vessels of any type which have been used for serving and consumption of beer shall be removed by the permittee from the area or areas where the beer hadbeen consumed and shall be placed in areas not for access by patrons of the establishment.

8-215. Hotel/Motel Classification Requirements and Restrictions.

- a. It shall be lawful for the Beer Board to issue a permit for the sale of beer to hotels, motels, or inns, subject to the limitations and restrictions contained in the state law and the rules and regulations contained in the permit required by this chapter.
- b. Permits may be issued under this section to hotels, motels, or inns for sale and consumption on the premises in rooms where meals or lunches are served, all enclosed areas of the hotel/motel and in guests' rooms.
- c. Beer also may be sold and dispensed to adult guests only through locked, in-room units.
- d. Beer sold from a "convenience store" located within the confines of the sight and oversight of a paid employee may only be sold for consumption on the premises and to a guest of the hotel.
- e. The permittee is responsible for verifying the age and guest status of the purchaser.
- f. In the case of locked in-room units, a key separate from that used to enter the room shall be supplied and no person under the age of twenty-one (21) shall be issued or supplied with such akey.

8-216. Craft Beer Enterprise Requirements and Restrictions.

- a. A craft beer enterprise shall meet the definition found in § 8-201.
- b. A craft beer enterprise may exist without a corresponding City manufacturing permit.
- c. A craft beer enterprise shall be required to have no less than thirty-four percent (34%) of the gross revenue of the enterprise generated from the serving of meals. Each permit holder is to submit annually the individual gross sales of both meals and beer prior to the permit being renewed. If it is determined an independent audit of said records should occur the permit holder is to provide all necessary records. If a permit holder fails to provide such records then their on-premise beer permit shall automatically be revoked.
- d. Have a minimum of eighty (80) seats in which eighty percent (80%) must be in the interior of the building under a permanent roof and enclosed on all sides. The remaining twenty percent (20%) may be in an open air or patio area as permitted by subsection (e). Seats are to be counted by individual chairs or in the use of bench seats, twenty-two inches (22") would equal one (1) seat. Bench seats should not protrude past table edges. In case of any outdoor seating, the outdoor seating area must be accessible from the inside of the restaurant or eating place and the outdoor seating area must have some type of permanent enclosure around it, such as a wall or fencing. All table and chair locations are to meet all building, fire and life safety codes and regulations.
- e. A permittee having this category of license shall be allowed to sell and serve on a patio or open air area, for which access is provided only by going through the interior of the building. The patio or open air area shall be enclosed by a permanent fence, railing, or similar structure, a minimum of forty-two inches (42") in height, which obstructs normal walking access to the patio or open air area, except by entry through the interior of the building. The fence, railing, or other structure shall have at least one (1) emergency exit, to be opened only in the event of an emergency and so marked, which will emit an audible sound, such as a bell, siren or other like sound, when the emergency exit is opened. Additional such exits may be required depending on the size of the fenced in area, as specified in the Goodlettsville Fire Protection Ordinance.
- f. Within thirty (30) minutes from the time that sale of beer has ceased as required by § 8-210(b), all containers, glasses or other vessels of any type which have been used for serving and consumption of beer shall be removed by permittee from the area or areas where the beer had been consumed and shall be placed in areas not for access by patrons of the establishment.

8-217. Caterer Classification Requirements and Restrictions.

- a. Meet the requirements of Tennessee Code Annotated § 57-4-102(6) as a "Caterer".
- b. Beer may be sold for consumption only at the permanent catering hall of the caterer or at a site for which the caterer has given advance notice to the City Clerk.
- c. Only employees of a licensed caterer may serve beer at any event, whether at the caterer's designated premises or a remote venue.
- d. No caterer may provide only alcohol without meals present and available for consumption at any catered event.

8-218. Golf Courses Classification.

Proprietors of golf courses, on-premises shall mean within the building or on any decks, patios and other outdoor serving areas that are contiguous to the exterior of the building and/or the course. Where on premises consumption is permitted on a golf course, beer may be purchased either at the restaurant, club house or from a beverage cart.

8-219. Existing Venues holding a specifically named On-Premises Consumption permit.

Any venue holding an On-Premises Consumption permit at the time of the adoption of this ordinance, but not fitting into one of the other permit classes shall receive a special venue permit with such conditions that were imposed under the previously codified ordinance as of the date of the adoption of this ordinance.

All beer permits now issued and outstanding will be classified and placed in an appropriate category under this ordinance, and the holders of said beer permits shall be so notified and shall be provided a copy of this ordinance.

8-220. Outdoor Venue Approval (Special Event).

Beer may be sold on a temporary basis at an Outdoor Venue by businesses holding an On-Premises Permit under the following conditions:

- a. The location meets the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission's requirements for alcoholic service.
- b. An application has been submitted to the City Clerk for the location and dates where the beer will be sold or provided.
- c. The Permit Fee of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) per application has been paid and a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day of event.
- d. The City has adopted Administrative Policies that govern the process, timing, rules, and review procedures for Outdoor Venues. Copies of said policies shall be made available to all holders of permits for on-premises consumption.

8-221. Off-premises Consumption Sales.

The following classes of permits for off-premises consumption are established.

1. Package Retail Sales
2. Growler Sales

8-222. Package Retail Classification Requirements and Restrictions.

The monthly off-premises package retail beer sales of any establishment that holds an off-premises permit shall not exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the gross sales of the establishment. Each permit holder is to submit annually the individual gross sales of both beer and of any other products prior to their permit being renewed. If it is determined an independent audit of said records should occur the permit holder is to provide all necessary records. If a permit holder fails to provide such records then their off-premise permit shall automatically be revoked.

8-223. Growler Classification Requirements and Restrictions.

- a. A Growler permit may be held by the holder of any other on-premises or off-premises permit holder. A Growler permit may not be the only permit held by a permittee.
- b. Holders of the Growler permit may fill or refill growlers on demand with beer for off-premises consumption provided the label as required by this section is affixed to the growler.
- c. Each growler must be securely sealed and removed from the premises in its original sealed condition. Each growler shall bear a twist-type closure, cork, stopper, or plug. At the time of the sale and/or refilling, a paper or plastic adhesive band, strip, or sleeve shall be applied to the container or bottle and extend over the top of the twist-type closure,

cork, stopper, or plug forming a seal that must be broken upon opening of the container or bottle. The adhesive band, strip, or sleeve shall bear the name and address of the business filling the growler. The containers or bottles shall be labeled as a craft beer, contain the name of the beer, and bear the name, address and telephone number of the business selling the beer. Any known allergens shall also be included on any label.

- d. Growlers must be filled in a manner that is sanitary and meets all applicable food and alcohol handling laws and standards.
- e. Consumption of the contents of any growler on the premises where it was filled is strictly prohibited. However, the license may provide free samples of any beer on tap. Each such sample shall not exceed one (1) fluid ounce.
- f. Sales of growlers shall be limited to the legal hours during which the licensee may sell such alcoholic beverages and must be removed from the premises before the applicable closing time.

8-224. Prohibited acts pertaining to beer and beer places.

It is unlawful for any beer permit holder or his agent or employee:

- (a) To employ any person convicted for the possession, sale, manufacturing or transportation of intoxicating liquor or any crime involving moral turpitude within the past ten (10) years;
- (b) To employ any person that has been convicted within the past ten (10) years of any crime involving moral turpitude. For purposes of this subsection, "moral turpitude" means premeditated murder, all sex related crimes, the illegal sale of Schedule I and II controlled substances, and crimes of fraud and embezzlement.
- (c) To make or permit to be made any sale of beer to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age;
- (d) To sell, give away, or allow beer to be consumed on any premises granted a permit under this chapter from 3:00 AM. to 6:00 AM. on weekdays and from 3:00 AM. to 10:00 A.M. on Sundays;
- (e) To allow any person under eighteen (18) years of age hereafter referred to as a minor to loiter or congregate about the premises. The burden of ascertaining the age of minor persons shall be on the permit holder and his agent or employee. When a minor is seated at a table, there shall be no beer served at the table unless such minor is accompanied by one or both of his parents, but only if served in conjunction with food;
- (f) To make false statement of a material fact in his application for any beer permit;
- (g) To operate a disorderly place;
- (h) To knowingly allow beer to be passed from a lawful purchaser or possessor to any individual under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age for consumption on the premises of the permit holder. The burden of ascertaining the age of persons who may not lawfully possess beer shall be on the permit holder and his agent or employee;
- (i) For a retailer to knowingly sell to a lawful purchaser who purchases beer for consumption by an individual under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age. The burden of ascertaining the age of persons who may lawfully possess beer shall be on the permit holder and his agent or employee;
- (j) To permit boisterous or disorderly conduct on the premises;
- (k) To sell or transfer the equipment or assets of the business authorized by his permit to another for the purpose of continuing the business on the same premises, unless he shall notify the board in writing immediately upon such sale or transfer, and unless he shall give the name and address of the purchaser within said notice. A beer permit holder shall surrender his license to the board within fifteen (15) days after the sale or transfer is consummated;

- (l) Allow any intoxicated person to loiter on or about the premises;
- (m) For a retailer or wholesaler, to store beer in any place other than the address listed on the permit;
- (n) To sell or allow to be sold on the premises of the permittee beer to any person using food stamps issued pursuant to state or federal law for the purchase of such beer;
- (o) To allow gambling or gambling devices of any kind or description contrary to state law on the premises;
- (p) To allow solicitation for purposes of prostitution on the premises;
- (q) To allow or engage in any criminal activity on the premises.

8-225. Application for permit authorizing the sale of beer.

1. Before any permit is issued by the Beer Board, the applicant shall make payment of a non-refundable application fee in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) to the City and file with the Board a written application, under oath, containing the following information:
 - (a) The name of the applicant
 - (b) The residential and business address of the applicant. If the person applying for the permit is acting as agent for another person or entity, the name and address of such other person or entity shall be listed.
 - (c) The owner or owners of the place of business must provide a copy as recorded in the Davidson or Sumner County Register of Deeds office of the deed for the property evidencing ownership of the premises upon which the sale of beer will be conducted. If the premises are subject to a lease or rental agreement, a copy of all executed documents evidencing the right to use the premises must be submitted with the application. A copy of the current lease or rental agreement must be kept on file with the Board at all times. If a lease or rental agreement is renewed, a copy of the renewed lease or rental agreement must be provided to the Board.
 - (d) A valid copy of the applicant's Tennessee Department of Revenue sales and use tax certificate of registration.
 - (e) An authorization for criminal history inquiry form must be provided for each person having at least five percent (5%) ownership interest in the business, along with a copy of each such person's driver's license. All criminal history checks are to be paid by the applicant.
2. An application shall become null and void if it is not presented to the Board at a public meeting within three (3) months after the application is filed, or if another application for a permit for the same location is approved before the application is presented to the Board at a public meeting.

8-226. Privilege tax.

There is hereby imposed on the business of selling, distributing, storing or manufacturing beer an annual privilege tax of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Any person or entity engaged in the sale, distribution, storage or manufacture of beer shall remit the tax on January 1, 1994, and each successive January 1, to the City. At the time each new permit is issued to any business subject to this tax, the permittee shall be required to pay the privilege tax on a prorated basis for each month or portion thereof remaining until the next tax payment date.

The annual privilege tax notice of payment due shall be mailed to the permittee no later than thirty (30) days prior to January 1 of each year. Notice shall be mailed to the address specified by the permittee on the permit application. The annual privilege tax shall be payable and due no later than January 31 of each year. If a permittee does not pay the privilege tax by January 31 of each

year, then the City shall notify the permittee in writing, either by certified mail or by hand delivery by a member of the City Police Department, which the privilege tax is past due. If a permittee does not pay the tax within ten (10) days after receiving notice of its delinquency, then the permit shall automatically become revoked and void and any further sales of the licensed beverage after that time shall be illegal and in violation of the City Beer Ordinance.

8-227. Permits not transferable - cessation of business - relocation - name change - change of ownership.

- a. Except as set forth in subsection (b) below, a permittee must return a permit to sell beer to the City Clerk within fifteen (15) days of termination of the business, change in ownership, relocation of the business, or change of the business names. The provisions of this section regarding change in ownership shall not apply to a permittee that is a publicly held company. If

the permittee is an entity other than a publicly held company, a change in ownership shall occur, for purposes of this chapter, when control of at least fifty percent (50%) interest, whether it be stock or otherwise, in the entity is transferred to a new owner. Notwithstanding the failure to return a beer permit, as provided herein, a permit shall expire on the date of termination of business, change of ownership, relocation of the business, or change of the business name.

- b. Immediately upon the Beer Board's acting on the new owner's application, shall surrender that permit to the City Clerk within fifteen (15) days. Any violation of any part or provision of this chapter by the new owner/applicant while the application is pending shall automatically result in the application being denied and the applicant shall not be eligible to apply for a beer permit within the City for a period of six (6) months.

8-228. Suspension or Revocation.

The Beer Board is vested with the full and complete power and authority to suspend, cancel, or revoke permits to sell beer upon the following grounds:

- (1) Any violation of the provisions of this chapter.
- (2) Any violation of any law of the State of Tennessee, now in existence or hereinafter adopted, regulating the sale, manufacture or distribution of beer.
- (3) Any violation of the provisions of title 57, chapter 4 Tennessee Code Annotated, regarding the consumption of alcoholic beverages on premises, to the extent permitted by the provisions of said title 57.

8-229. Procedure.

- (1) When the Beer Board has reason to believe that any permittee has violated any of the provisions of this chapter or any provision of state law regarding regulating the sale, manufacture or distribution of beer, the Board is authorized in its discretion to notify the permittee of the

violation in writing and to give notice that the permittee must appear and show cause why the permit should not be suspended or revoked for the alleged violations. The notice to appear and show cause shall state the nature of the violation and shall be served upon the permittee either by certified mail or by a member of the City Police Department. The notice shall be served on or mailed to the permittee at least ten (10) days before the date scheduled for the hearing. The Beer Board shall, at the public hearing, allow evidence to be presented on behalf of the holder of the permit and thereafter, in its discretion, either dismiss the charges or complaint, or suspend or revoke the permit. The action of the Beer Board shall, in all such hearings, be final, subject only to review by a court of competent jurisdiction as provided by state law. When a permit is revoked, no new permit at the same location for the sale of beer shall be issued hereunder to the permittee,

or to any person or entity having any ownership interest in the permittee, until the expiration of one (1) year from the date the revocation becomes final.

- (2) If the State Alcoholic Beverage Commission suspends or revokes a license to sell alcoholic beverages on the premises at any establishment for any violation or violations as provided in title 57, chapter 4, Tennessee Code Annotated, and the Commission notifies the Beer Board by certified mail, return receipt requested, of the action taken by the Commission, and includes with such notice the record of evidence and the determination made by the Commission in suspending or revoking the license of establishment, then upon receipt of such notice, the Beer Board may temporarily suspend the beer permit of the establishment and shall:
 - (a) Schedule a hearing for the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Beer Board to be held at least fourteen (14) days following the date the Beer Board receives the certified letter to provide an opportunity for the permit holder to appear and show cause why the permit to sell beer on the premises should not be suspended or revoked for a violation or violations as provided in title 57, chapter 4, based on actions taken by the Commission; and
 - (b) Notify the individual or business entity, which is listed as the permit holder at the same location where the alcoholic beverage license had been suspended or revoked, of the date and time of the hearing.
- (3) If the Beer Board finds at a hearing that a sufficient violation or violations have occurred as provided in title 57, chapter 4, at such location, then the Beer Board may suspend or revoke the permit to the same extent and at least for the same period of time as the Commission has suspended or revoked the license of the establishment.
- (4) If the permit holder fails to appear or decides to surrender the permit to the Beer Board in lieu of appearing at the hearing the permit may be suspended or revoked by the Beer Board; provided, that if the permit is suspended or revoked, no permit to sell beer on the premises shall be issued by the Beer Board to any person for the location where the Commission has suspended or revoked the license for the period of time included in the decision of the Commission.
- (5) Pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 57-5-608, the Beer Board shall not revoke or suspend the permit of a "responsible vendor" qualified under the requirements of Tennessee Code Annotated § 57-5-606 for a clerk's illegal sale of beer to a minor if the clerk is properly certified and has attended annual meetings since the clerk's original certification, unless the vendor's status as a certified responsible vendor has been revoked by the alcoholic beverage commission. If the responsible vendor's certification has been revoked, the vendor shall be punished by the Beer Board as if the vendor were not certified as a responsible vendor. "Clerk" means any person working in a capacity to sell beer directly to consumers for off-premises consumption. Under Tennessee Code Annotated § 57-5-608, the alcoholic beverage commission shall revoke a vendor's status as a responsible vendor upon notification by the Beer Board that the board has made a final determination that the vendor has sold beer to a minor for the second time in a consecutive twelve (12) month period. The revocation shall be for three (3) years.
- (6) The decision of the Beer Board is final, and any party aggrieved thereby may appeal the decision of the Beer Board in accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated § 57-5-108.

8-230. Civil penalty in lieu of suspension.

- (1) Definition. "Responsible vendor" means a person, corporation or other entity that has been issued a permit to sell beer and has received certification by the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission under the "Tennessee Responsible Vendor Act of 2006," Tennessee Code Annotated § 57-5-601, et seq.
- (2) Penalty, revocation or suspension. The Beer Board may, at the time it imposes a revocation or suspension, offer a permit holder that is not a responsible vendor the alternative of paying a civil penalty not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) for each offense or making or permitting to be made any sales to minors, or a civil penalty not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for any other offense.

The Beer Board may impose on a responsible vendor a civil penalty not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for each offense of making or permitting to be made any sales to minors or for any other offense.

If a civil penalty is offered as an alternative to revocation or suspension, the holder shall have seven (7) days within which to pay the civil penalty before the revocation or suspension shall be imposed. If the civil penalty is paid within that time, the revocation or suspension shall be deemed withdrawn. Payment of the civil penalty in lieu of revocation or suspension by a permit holder shall be an admission by the holder of the violation so charged and shall be paid to the exclusion of any other penalty that the City may impose.

8-231. Loss of clerk's certification for sale to a minor.

If the Beer Board determines that a clerk of an off-premises beer permit holder certified under Tennessee Code Annotated §57-5-606 sold beer to a minor, the Beer Board shall report the name of the clerk to the alcoholic beverage commission within fifteen (15) days of determination of the sale. The certification of the clerk shall be invalid and the clerk may not reapply for a new certificate for a period of one (1) year from the date of the Beer Board's determination.

8-232. Severability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this chapter is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion hereof.

This ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days from and after its final passage, the public welfare requiring it.

ORDINANCE 21-1004

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 11 BY CREATING A CHAPTER 11 AS IT RELATES TO BLOCKING SIDEWALKS, STREETS AND RIGHT-OF-WAY.

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the need to create regulations in regards to the blocking of sidewalks, streets and rights of way currently exists within the city; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Goodlettsville deems it in the best interest of the to approve an ordinance that would regulate the blocking of sidewalks, street, and rights-of-way.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE, TENNESSEE THAT THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENTS ARE ADOPTED AS FOLLOWS:

§ Title 11 – Chapter 11

(1) Purpose. It is the intent of this section to eliminate the obstruction of free passage over, on or along a street, sidewalk, or public right-of-way, whether such obstruction results from the manner in which a person or number of persons shall stand, loiter, walk, sit, lie or camp on said street, sidewalk or public right-of-way

(2) Definitions. For purposes of this section, the following words shall be defined as provided herein:

(a) An "obstruction" within the meaning of this section shall be construed to mean to so occupy the sidewalk, street or public right-of-way that the free use and enjoyment thereof by the public is, in any way interrupted or interfered with, or the free ingress or egress to or from any building fronting on any public right-of-way is impaired.

(b) The term "camp" or "camping" shall mean the use of a street, sidewalk or public right-of-way, including a public transit stop, bench or other public property on any street, sidewalk or public right-of-way, as a temporary or permanent place of dwelling, lodging, or residence, or as a living accommodation at any-time. Indicia of camping may include, but are not limited to, storage of personal belongings, using tents or other temporary structures for sleeping or storage of personal belongings, carrying on cooking activities or making any fire, or any of these activities in combination with one another or in combination with either sleeping or making preparations to sleep (including the laying down of bedding for the purpose of sleeping).

(3) Prohibited behavior. It is unlawful for any person or any number of persons:

(a) To so stand, loiter, walk, sit, lie, or camp upon any street, public sidewalk, privately owned but publicly used sidewalks or public right-of-way in the city so as to obstruct free

passage over, on or along said street, sidewalk or public right-of-way, after a request by a law enforcement officer to move on so as to cease blocking or obstructing free passage thereon.

(b) By placing an object or objects on a street, sidewalk or public right-of-way in the city, to cause a condition of obstruction or blockage of a street, sidewalk or public right-of-way so as to obstruct free passage over, on or along said street, sidewalk or public right-of-way.

(c) By parking a vehicle or any other mobile equipment on a street, sidewalk or public right-of-way in the city, to cause a condition of obstruction or blockage of a street, sidewalk or public right-of-way so as to obstruct free passage over, on or along said street, sidewalk or public right-of-way.

(4) Applicability. The provisions of subsection (3)(a) hereof apply only when a person or number of persons shall stand, loiter, walk, sit, lie, or camp on a street, sidewalk or public right-of-way so as to obstruct free passage thereon and shall refuse to obey a request by a law enforcement officer to move on; mere refusal to move on is not enough to support the offense - there must be an actual blocking of free passage over, on or along said street, sidewalk or public right-of-way. This section shall not apply to "assemblies" or "parades", taking place on a street, sidewalk or public right-of-way, unless any such assembly or parade creates and/or causes a hazardous condition or threatens public safety.

THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT FIFTEEN (15) DAYS FROM ITS PASSAGE, THE PUBLIC WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS OF GOODLETTSVILLE, TENNESSEE REQUIRING IT.

SECTION 2. That the Commissioners of the City of Goodlettsville, Tennessee, hereby certify that this Ordinance has been submitted to the Planning Commission of the City of Goodlettsville for a recommendation, and a notice of hearing thereon has been ordered after at least fifteen (15) days notice of the time and place of said meeting has been published in a newspaper circulated in the City of Goodlettsville, Tennessee. This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days from the date of its final passage, the public welfare demanding it.

SECTION 3. If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason declared invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance which is not itself invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. In case of conflict between this Ordinance or any part thereof and the whole or part of any existing or future Ordinance of the City of Goodlettsville, the most restrictive shall in all cases apply.

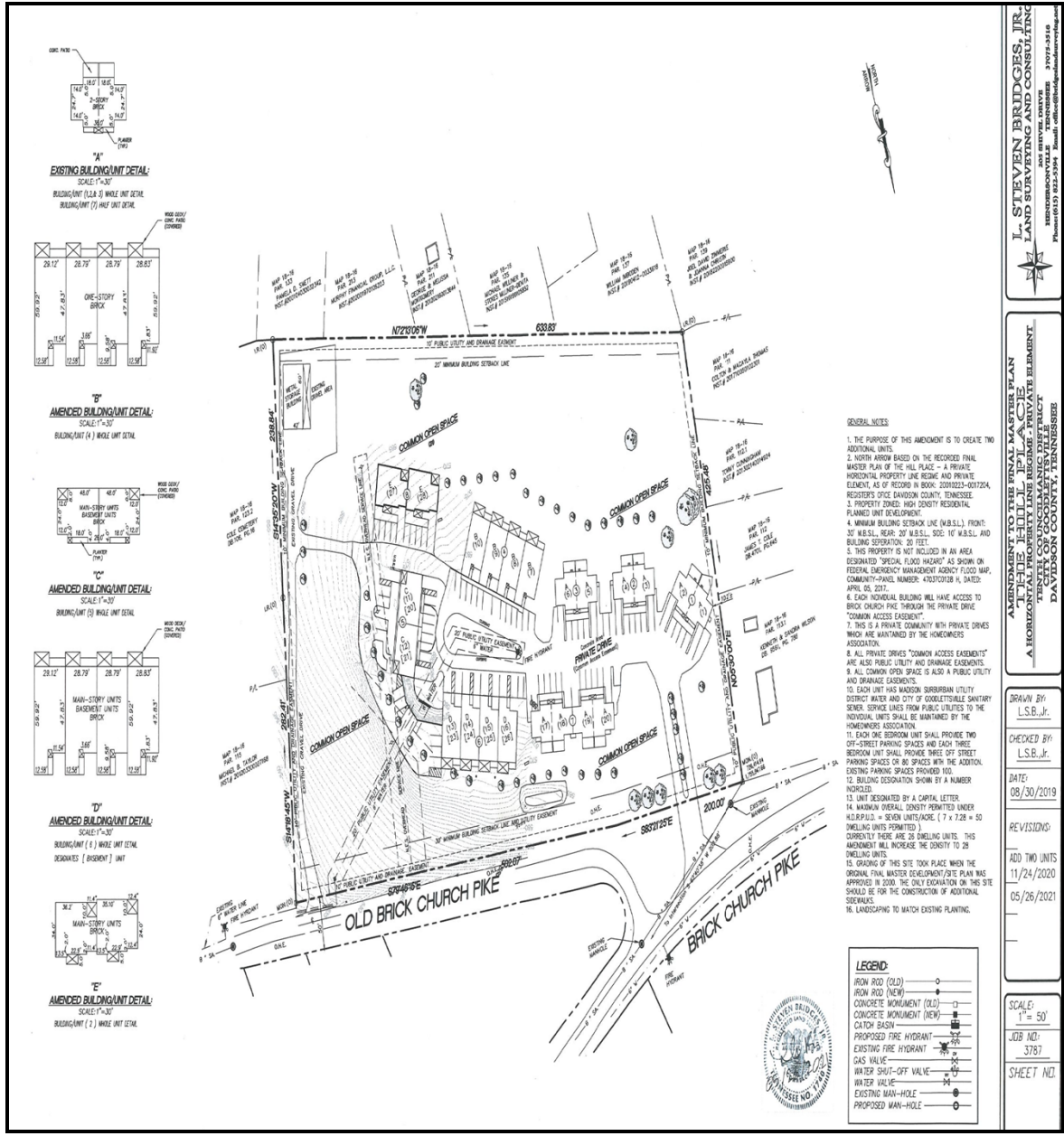

CHAPTER 29

NONPROFIT CONTRIBUTIONS

- Section 1 Municipal officials should ensure that all organizations requesting an appropriation of funds for financial aid are either nonprofit charitable or nonprofit civic organizations (*TCA 6-54-111*).
- Section 2 Municipal officials should develop guidelines addressing the purpose(s) for which money disbursed to nonprofit organizations may be expended.
- Section 3 The city clerk should have complete files on all nonprofit organizations requesting financial assistance. Those files should include, at a minimum, an annual audit, a description of the program that serves the residents of the municipality, and the proposed use of the municipal assistance.
- Section 4 Municipal officials should ensure that notices are published in a newspaper of general circulation notifying residents of the intent to make an appropriation to a nonprofit, but non-charitable, organization. The notification should include the name of the organization and the amount of the proposed appropriation and the purposes for which the appropriation will be spent.

EMPLOYEE LEAVE COVID VACCINATION INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Any employee who chooses to become fully vaccinated against the COVID-19 Virus will be eligible to receive one (1) day of incentive leave under the following terms of the program:

Requirements:

1. Each Employee is to be **fully** vaccinated by either the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine no later than October 1, 2021.
2. Employees must submit proof of vaccination to the Human Resources Department prior to October 1, 2021.

Incentive Leave Requirements:

1. Employees will have twelve (12) months from the time they submit their proof of vaccination to use Incentive Leave.
2. Employees who were vaccinated prior to the creation of this incentive program shall also be eligible to receive this incentive leave and they shall have twelve (12) months from the approval of said program to utilize said leave (This includes all approved covid vaccination types).

WHEREAS, the City's Zoning Ordinance, intent and purpose includes regulations to protect the character and maintain the stability of residential, business, commercial, and manufacturing areas within the City and to fix reasonable standards to which structures shall conform; and,

WHEREAS, the City's Zoning Ordinance, intent and purpose includes to divide the city into zones and districts restricting and regulating therein the location, construction, reconstruction, alteration, and use of buildings, structures, business, commercial, manufacturing, and other specified uses; and,

WHEREAS, the Zoning Ordinance amendment includes provisions for larger square footage billboard size sign facilities within defined commercial and industrial zoning districts along the I-65 corridor and not conflict with the accessory use sign ordinance maximum sign square footage and sign height provisions by creating a primary use interstate advertisement facility use in certain commercial and industrial zoning districts and,

WHEREAS, the Goodlettsville Planning Commission at the August 2, 2021 regularly scheduled meeting unanimously voted to deny its passage to the Board of Commissioners and discussed that no additional large billboard size signs are desired along the I-65 corridor; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF GOODLETTSVILLE, TENNESSEE, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. O6-674 adopted on second and final reading on June 22, 2006, being the municipal zoning ordinance of Goodlettsville, Tennessee, be and the same is hereby amended including new Sections 14-206 (8). Commercial District Regulations and 14-207 (6) Industrial District Regulations to include the Primary Use Interstate Advertisement Facility use and details about the use location and design limitations in the CSL, Commercial Service Limited and IG, Industrial General and IR, Industrial Restricted Zoning Districts for properties along I-65 as shown in "EXHIBIT A"

SECTION 2. That Ordinance No. O6-674 adopted on second and final reading on June 22, 2006, being the municipal zoning ordinance of Goodlettsville, Tennessee, be and the same is hereby amended by adding a permitted use notation for the Primary Use Interstate Advertisement Facility in Appendix A, Table 1 Land Use Activity Matrix as listed in "EXHIBIT B".

SECTION 3. That the Commissioners of the City of Goodlettsville, Tennessee, hereby certify that this Ordinance has been submitted to the Planning Commission of the City of Goodlettsville for a recommendation, and a notice of hearing thereon has been ordered after at least fifteen (15) days notice of the time and place of said meeting has been published in a newspaper circulated in the City of Goodlettsville, Tennessee. This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) day from the date of its final passage, the public welfare demanding it.

SECTION 4. If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason declared invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall

not affect any other section, clause, provision, or portion, of this Ordinance which is not itself invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. In case of conflict between this Ordinance or any part thereof and the whole or part of any existing or future Ordinance of the City of Goodlettsville, the most restrictive shall in all cases apply.

The site plan shall include sign location and site design to access the signage for maintenance both of which can be located on an existing developed site. The proposed signage shall be approved by the Tennessee Department of Transportation including digital message board timing and brightness standards and spacing to other type signs. The sign shall be a minimum of five hundred (500') feet from any permitted high rise pole signs on the property within the Interstate Sign Zone provisions of this Ordinance.

Zoning Ordinance 14-207 (6) (New Section)

Primary Use Interstate Advertisement Facility Use

On properties adjacent to the I-65 interstate corridor right-of-way and zoned IG, Industrial General and IR, Industrial Restricted, the Planning Commission shall review a site plan for an advertising facility use including a parallel two-side sign with sign angle faces angled no more than thirty (30) degrees and not exceeding one hundred (100') feet in height and 750 square feet in area. The sign location and installation included sign faces shall be directed with the interstate corridor as the primary direction of visibility of the sign. The sign is to be located within one hundred and fifty (150') feet on the interstate corridor and may be a changeable copy electronic message board. The sign is to be a minimum of three hundred (300') feet from any adjacent residential zoning district boundaries. The site plan shall include sign location and site design to access the signage for maintenance both of which can be located on an existing developed site. The proposed signage shall be approved by the Tennessee Department of Transportation including digital message board timing and brightness standards and spacing to other type signs. The sign shall be a minimum of five hundred (500') feet from any permitted high rise pole signs on the property within the Interstate Sign Zone provisions of this Ordinance.

The Zoning Ordinance amendment is due to a request by Kenjoh Outdoor requesting a revised sign height of ninety (90') feet and 750 square feet digital (billboard type size) sign at 705 Rivergate Parkway. The sign is proposed to be located behind the building owned and operated by Victory Church of Nashville. Within the Goodlettsville City limits there are thirteen (13) legal non-conforming billboard type signs along the west side of I-65 and five (5) along the east side of I-65 and one sign adjacent to SR-386 along the east side of I-65. The billboard signs are non-conforming signs based on the square footage of all the signs and the location of some of the signs. The information included with the meeting packet includes the applicant's sign proposal including the TDOT, Tennessee Department of Transportation permit and approval and the timeline associated with their request. The applicant discussed with staff a sign variance option and staff recommend first to discuss with the Planning Commission if the proposed location of the billboard type sign would be possible. The City previously amended the sign ordinance to be a content neutral sign ordinance format which defines sign regulations including location and height. The proposed square footage of the proposed sign exceeds the current maximum square footage for pole signage within the interstate sign district (subject to signage location on the property) at 227.5 sq. ft. which is the maximum thirty (30%) percent increased square footage permitted over the base maximum 175 square footage. The City has defined interstate interchange sign districts for high rise signs. Signs installed under the sign ordinance are regulated as accessory uses of the primary use of the property. An example would be pole sign, high rise interstate sign, entrance and exit signs and menu boards for a drive thru fast food restaurant. The restaurant would be primary use of the property and the signs are accessory to the restaurant. The proposed sign location is within the Rivergate Parkway exit 96 interstate sign district overlay. Per the proposed location of the sign on the property, the City's ordinance permits subject to Planning Commission's review and approval a maximum sign height of ninety (90') feet and 227.5 square feet in area. The applicant discussed possible variances, but the Board of Zoning Appeals would not have any legitimate or legal basis to grant a variance for a

signage increase from 227.5 to 750 square feet. The Zoning Ordinance amendment includes creating a primary interstate advertisement proposed use approval process for properties adjacent to I-65 zoned CSL, Commercial Services Limited and IG, Industrial General and IR, Industrial Restricted. An applicant would be required to submit a site plan to the Planning Commission for review and approval. The ordinance amendment is not included in the sign ordinance to provide a separate regulation from the general signage and interstate sign district provisions. The ordinance amendment is creating the billboard type sign as a primary use of the property in addition to other permitted primary uses on the property. The ordinance amendment would also permit similar type signs along interstate frontage meeting the defined criteria. The amendment was not only for the applicant's request. The ordinance amendment was prepared by staff to incorporate the requested signage.

The applicant has requested a revised proposed zoning amendment to only permit one more sign instead of possible more with the ordinance amendment. The applicant's revised proposed zoning ordinance amendment would permit a billboard type sign per the applicant in a perfect location that would also provide a benefit for the Victory Church of Nashville, Inc property owner. The revised amendment includes limiting the larger square footage sign allowance to the current interchange overlay district. The revised amendment would only permit the billboard size sign in the interstate sign overlay. Per the applicant due to TDOT spacing requirements, the proposed billboard type sign location would be the only valid spot for an additional TDOT billboard size sign. The applicant requests the revised amendment since it would be the easiest change and would not allow dozens of other larger square footage signs. The applicant discussed their revised amendment will limit the new billboard sign to a district that is intended for similar signs that are compatible with highway travel which billboards are typically associated with highway travel. The applicant's proposed revised Zoning Ordinance Amendment:

14-305. Signs Permitted in Commercial and Industrial Districts (2)(e)

(2) Interchange sign zone. Within the area of the interchanges of I-65 and Rivergate Parkway, Long Hollow Pike, and U.S. 31W identified as "Interstate Sign Zone" as shown on the attached maps, the following provisions shall apply and be in addition to and supplement § 14-305(1). All other pertinent provisions of § 14-305(1) remain as applicable.

(a) Signs installed under this section, the maximum height for a pole sign shall be sixty feet (60') and the minimum height shall be forty feet (40') and the pole sign is to be located between the back of the primary building and the rear property line unless the property contains site limitations that prevent the sign installation and if the sign location would create limited sign visibility as determined during site plan review.

(b) The maximum display surface area for a pole sign shall be one hundred seventy-five (175) square feet. Such display surface area shall include all permitted signage such as changeable copy and price signs. Any changeable copy sign shall be limited to no more than fifty percent (50%) of the total sign square footage, except that any changeable copy sign within one hundred fifty feet (150') of the interstate right-of-way may be one hundred percent (100%) of the sign square

footage.

(c) Wall signs shall be a maximum size of fifteen percent (15%) of the area of the wall upon which they are mounted.

(d) A maximum of one (1) pole sign shall be permitted on a property and any additional non-building sign permitted based on property frontage shall be a ground sign.

(e) Outdoor advertising signs as defined and approved by the TDOT, Tennessee Department of Transportation and at least 200 feet from any residential zoning district or property.

The applicant discussed their proposed revised ordinance amendment at the August 2, 2021 Planning Commission meeting. The Planning Commission decided not to recommend the ordinance amendment prepared by staff or the applicant's discussed revised amendment recommendation to the City Commission to permit additional billboard type sign or signs along the I-65 corridor within the Goodlettsville City limits.

Dear Dan:

At your request, I've reviewed the sign and zoning ordinances of the City of Goodlettsville, TN ("City" or "Goodlettsville"), and it is my opinion that the permit application ("Permit" or "Application") submitted by Kenjoh Outdoor Advertising ("Kenjoh") for the erection of a billboard in the City should be granted.

In connection with this opinion, please note the following:

First, I note that the Tennessee Department of Transportation ("TnDOT") has issued a Permit to Kenjoh for the erection of the billboard. TnDOT was correct in such issuance, and Goodlettsville should do so as well.

Second, Section 14-307 of the City's regulations is the only time the word "billboard" is used. I never saw the words "off-premise" or "on-premise" signs used in either the sign or zoning ordinances. And, since this Section basically allows billboards to the extent that they are allowed under the Federal Highway Beautification Act, which in turn allows billboards termed "off-premises signs" subject to certain height, size, and spacing criteria, the City should therefore allow them under the same circumstances. Indeed, as mentioned above, TnDOT has even issued a Permit under the Tennessee Highway Beautification Act, which is a so-called "mirror law" and identical to the Federal Highway Beautification Act; so, the allowance and issuance of the City's Permit is automatic.

Third, the lengthy zoning ordinance doesn't even define or mention "billboards" or "off-premise signs," lending further argument that they are not prohibited or even contemplated.

Fourth, Chapter 3 is the City's sign ordinance, and the definitions Section 14-302 once again fails to list "billboard" or "off-premise sign," even though just about every other conceivable type of "sign" is defined. Once again, this supports the argument that billboards were not contemplated as prohibited.

Fifth, Section 14-303(6)(a)-(m) provides the laundry list of “prohibited and illegal” signs, and there is no reference to “billboards” or “off-premise signs,” making this provision supportive of Kenjoh’s position as well.

In conclusion, Goodlettsville’s regulations provide for the issuance of Kenjoh’s Permit. Let me know if you have any questions, or if I can be of any other assistance.

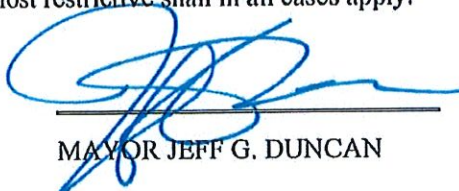

A high rise sign located between 200 feet and 300 feet from the roadway providing direct access may be permitted a ten (10%) sign area increase in sign area, 300 feet -400 feet from roadway providing direct access may be permitted a twenty (20%) percent increase in sign area, and a sign exceeding 400 feet from the roadway providing direct access may be permitted a maximum thirty (30%) percent increase in sign area.*

Such display surface area shall include all permitted signage such as changeable copy and price signs. Any changeable copy sign shall be limited to no more than fifty percent (50%) of the total sign square footage, except that any changeable copy sign within one hundred fifty feet (150') of the interstate right-of-way may be one hundred percent (100%) of the sign square footage.

(c) Wall signs shall be a maximum size of fifteen percent (15%) of the area of the wall upon which they are mounted.

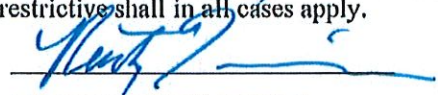

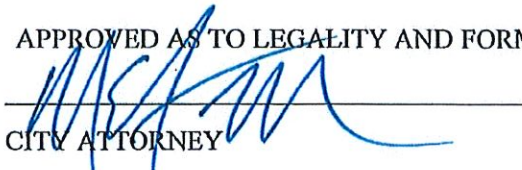

The Planning Commission in review of a project site plan for a property within the Interstate Sign Zone designated areas may permit an increased sign height for a high rise sign based on the distance the high rise sign is located from the roadway providing direct access to the property per the following sign area increases and the visibility of the sign height from the interstate and interstate ramps. High rise signs that are permitted to be reviewed for increased height shall include a majority portion of the sign area within fifty (50') feet of the interstate right-of-way. WHEREAS, the in accordance with Tenn. Code Ann § 13-3-102, the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development, with the approval of the Local Government Planning Advisory Committee has designated the Goodlettsville Municipal Planning Commission as the Goodlettsville Regional Planning Commission for its future planning and for the purposes of controlling the subdivision of certain territory outside said City; and

It further appearing to the Court upon review of the attached Exhibits A, B, and C, that the Goodlettsville Police Department is in possession of certain miscellaneous property and evidence that cannot be returned to the persons from whom it was confiscated nor has any lawful owner come forward to claim such items listed on Exhibit A and certain types of any illegally controlled substances and drug paraphernalia which came into possession of the Police Department as confiscated and seized property generally received in connection with drug possession charges or other crimes and should be adjudicated as contraband listed on Exhibit B, and certain fire arms seized in connection with weapon violations, shootings or other crimes of violence listed on Exhibit C. It further appearing to the Court upon the sworn testimony of Officer Les Carlisle that all property listed in Exhibits A, B, and C have been in the possession of the Goodlettsville Police Department for at least one (1) year and that none of the items so listed are needed as evidence in any pending criminal investigation or prosecution.
