Chairman Denton called the meeting to order. Minutes of the previous meeting were unanimously approved.

The only item on the agenda was to review the existing on-premises permit for T. Michael's/Loredo's, located at 709 Two Mile Parkway.

The City Manager advised the Board the management of T. Michaels's has constructed a partition within their business creating a separate operation called Loredo's. After a recent inspection by officer Ken Hale of the Goodlettsville Police Department, he observed that T. Michael's was conducting a teen night where persons under 21 were allowed and invited to be on the premises at T. Michael's. On the other side of the partition, Loredo's was also operating and conducting the sale of alcoholic beverages. If T. Michael's and Loredo's is one establishment, this is a violation of the City Beer Ordinance. If Loredo's is a separate business, they have no permit for the sale of beer.

In order to further establish the situation at this location, officer Hale went back to this location on the following Tuesday evening, and Loredo's was operating, selling alcoholic beverages with T. Michael's side closed. Officer Hale asked for a beer permit for Loredo's, and the person in charge could neither produce a permit for Loredo's or T. Michael's. The manager voluntarily closed for the evening.

In subsequent discussions with Mike Patton, one of the owners of T. Michael's, he contended that T. Michael's and Loredo's constitute a single operation and business, and that Loredo's does not require a beer permit. He has submitted a letter dated May 10, 1991, stating his support for T. Michael's/Loredo's operating under one (T. Michael's) beer permit.

After hearing the report from the City Manager and Police Department and considering Mike Patton's letter, the Board discussed the matter with a great deal of concern regarding the manner in which the owners and management of this business have handled this situation. After lengthy discussion, it was the decision of the Board that they needed advice from the City Attorney regarding this matter. It was the decision of the Chairman to continue this meeting to Tuesday, May 28, 1991 at 5:00 P.M. or until the City Attorney was available to meet with them for further discussion.
