Chairman Denton called the meeting to order. Minutes of the previous meeting were unanimously approved.

The first item was to consider the request of Kirby Clifton, Jr., owner of Kirb Market, 845 Springfield Highway, for an off-premises permit. This location had recently been cited for sale of beer to a minor. There was discussion of this matter among the Board members. Denton moved to postpone regular permit until after court date of the citation and issue a temporary permit at this time until next meeting. The motion was seconded by Roy Duncan and unanimously approved.

The second item was to consider the request of Shirley Helen Shouse, new manager of Mapco Delta Express, 301 Long Hollow Pike, for an off-premises permit. This establishment had also recently been cited for sale of beer to a minor. Denton moved and Duncan seconded to

postpone regular permit until after court date and issue temporary permit at this time. The motion was unanimously approved.

Item three was to consider the request of Elizabeth Corinne Burton, new manager of Country Stars Inn, 622 Two Mile Parkway, for an on-premises permit. There being no problems on the background check of this applicant, Smith made a motion to grant the request, seconded by Duncan and unanimously approved.

Item four was to consider the request of T. Michael's, Two Mile Parkway, for an on-premises permit. Due to prior problems at another location in Nashville operated by this applicant and feedback from citizens and elected officials in the City, some concern was expressed regarding the operation of this club. The City Manager presented an anonymous letter that had been received by members of the Board and City Commissioners and advised of telephone calls received at City Hall expressing concern about this establishment due to problems at their Murfreesboro Road location. The Board was also advised that the City Manager and Police Chief, Fred Schott, had met with the applicant on two occasions to discuss their potential problems.

Chairman Denton asked the applicant to address the Board on how they planned to operate security at this location. Applicant addressed security as well as training that personnel receive in order to recognize when a person is intoxicated. Also addressed was the menu and food serving operation in order for them to meet the 51% requirement of gross receipts to be from food.

The Board members each addressed the applicant regarding their concerns that this be operated as an orderly establishment. Chief Schott advised the applicant the Police Department would strictly enforce the law.

Denton made a motion to approve the permit, seconded by Smith and unanimously adopted.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:15 P.M.
