Consider Resolution No. 07-345, a resolution to exercise a renewal option in an existing contract with Pinnacle Bank for two additional years of banking services. Finance Director High reported in 2005 the City accepted proposals for banking services from six banks. From those proposals the City chose to enter into a contract for banking services with Pinnacle Bank. The City has earned an increase of \$255,000 annually in interest earnings. They also waived all service fees and provide courier pick-up for all deposits at no charge. She reported their level of service has been exceptional. In the original agreement, the contract was for two years with an option to renew for two additional years. Based on the positive and successful relationship with Pinnacle, she recommended that the City exercise that option to renew for two more years. A motion was made by Commissioner Cordell to approve Resolution No. 07-345. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Coombs. Vice Mayor Finch disclosed that he does have a personal and business banking relationship with Pinnacle. Mayor Garrett also disclosed that he has a personal banking relationship with Pinnacle Bank. The motion passed unanimously 5-0.

Consider status of regular commission meeting scheduled for March 22, 2007. City Manager Thomas reported that there is currently no old or new business to consider for the next meeting. A motion was made by Commissioner Manning to cancel the March 22, 2007 meeting if there is no business to consider, and if it is determined that there is a new issue that should be addressed on that date, the meeting shall be scheduled at 4:30 p.m. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Finch and passed unanimously 5-0.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Garrett. Prayer was offered by Commissioner Cordell.

The City Recorder called the roll: Commissioner Cordell present, Vice Mayor Finch present, Mayor Garrett present, Commissioner Manning present and Commissioner Coombs present.

Consider approval of the minutes of the March 8, 2007 regular commission meeting. A motion was made by Commissioner Cordell to approve the minutes as submitted. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Coombs and passed unanimously 5-0.

138 Mayor Garrett asked if there were any citizens who wished to make any comments. There were none.

City Manager Thomas asked for guidance on his desire to dedicate revenue from recently negotiated billboard property leases to a city-wide greenways project. Mayor Garrett asked City Manager Thomas to place a resolution on the agenda for the next commission meeting for consideration.

City Manager Thomas reported that proposed legislation to amend state law governing liquor-by-the-drink has passed the full Senate with a unanimous vote. It will be on the agenda of the House to be heard at their meeting on April 16, 2007.

City Manager Thomas recognized the city employees nominated for the 2007 Timothy J. Myers Award and presented certificates to Harry Bell, Police Department, Claudia Davis, Administration Department, Jack Presley, Parks and Recreation Department, and Johnny Roberson, Fire Department. Donnie Allen, Public Works Department, was the award winner this year and was presented his award at a lunch meeting with his coworkers.

City Manager Thomas displayed recent awards received by the City and city employees. A special award was made by the Goodlettsville Area Chamber of Commerce at its annual banquet on March 22nd, recognizing the work performed by city employees in their response to the April 7, 2006 tornado. Another special award was received from resident members of Bakers Chapel C.M.E. Church recognizing the work performed by city employees responding to the tornado.

Commissioner Cordell described witnessing from his own home, the residential structure fire on March 21, 2007 at the home of Red and Linda Bryant at 505 Chickasaw Trail. As he watched the fire start and spread so fast, and the Fire and Police Departments arrived, he was so amazed at how professional they were in controlling the fire and protecting the adjoining homes. He stated this City is so fortunate to go to sleep peacefully each night because of all the excellent city employees. He thanked the Goodlettsville Fire Department personnel at the fire scene, Captain Ricky West, Lieutenant Ed Hendricks, Firefighter Ben McCoy, Firefighter David Dorris, Captain Johnny Roberson and Chaplain Jon Briggs. He thanked the Goodlettsville Police Department personnel at the fire scene, Chief Terry Hutcherson, Sergeant Gerri Peterson, Corporal Albert Vincent, Patrol Officer Tim Williams, Patrol Officer John Doble, Detective Les Carlisle, Patrol Officer Donnell Springer and Detective Sergeant Sammy Uldrich. He also recognized and thanked the personnel staged at the fire hall as a backup and who responded to numerous calls during that evening, Kevin Marcy, Randy Gentry, Morgan Vero, Scott Hurt, Keith Hendricks, Jason Davis, Lloyd Crawford and Randy Tomlinson. Commissioner Cordell recognized and thanked Ken Weidner, County Emergency Management Director, along with Sonny Briggance and Ernie Wuester who were also at the scene. He thanked all the companies with the Metro Nashville Fire Department, represented by District Chief Steve Holt. Commissioner Cordell further stated that all these personnel are his heroes. In addition to all of these employees, he added that City Manager Jim Thomas is a superman who is on the scene helping employees and citizens wherever and whenever there is a need. He stated this City is so very very blessed to have him.

Linda Bryant addressed all the personnel who responded to her home burning and expressed her sincerest gratitude for everything they did. She and her husband and grandchildren were sharing their home with a single Mom, and she feared they were in the burning home. One firefighter entered the burning structure two times. Fortunately, they were not in the home. She said that during the entire event, they were cared for and were in such good hands. Everyone knew what to do and they were so professional. She thanked all of her neighborhood and all the community for their support. Red Bryant thanked City Manager Thomas for staying with him till after midnight and assisting him around the property. He thanked Larry DiOrio for his support from the Codes Department and willingness to expedite all codes processes when they are ready to rebuild. Mr. and Mrs. Bryant presented a plaque to the Goodlettsville Fire Department, Goodlettsville Police Department and Metro Fire Department

for everything they have done for them.

Commissioner Coombs expressed that this incident truly represents the good in Goodlettsville. As a new commissioner, he stated he is so proud to be associated with such awesome employees who all deserve recognition every day and not just when there is an emergency. He invited everyone to participate in a simulcast presentation of a leadership event including Terry Bradshaw, Herman Moon, and several others at the Goodlettsville Cumberland Presbyterian Church. Seating is limited and the cost is \$60. All the proceeds will be forwarded to Bakers Chapel Church for their reconstruction. This is another opportunity to witness the wonderful community that we live in.

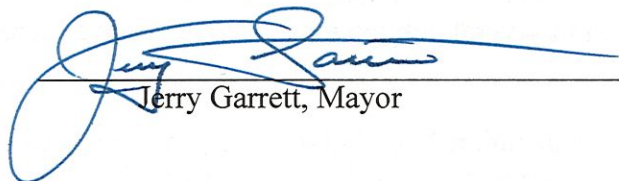
