The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Randall Moser. Motion was made by Driver, seconded by Cordell, to approve the minutes of the June 12, 2003 regular meeting. Passed 5-0.

Consider Ordinance No. 03-633, an ordinance of the City of Goodlettsville adopting a budget and establishing a property tax rate for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, through June, 2004. Motion was made by Garrett to approve Ordinance No. 03-633 on second reading, seconded by Cordell. Passed 5-0.

Consider Ordinance No. 03-634, an ordinance to rezone property of Fran Tinnin, changing the zoning classification from split zoning R10 and CSL to R10, certain property on Dorris Avenue, Davidson County Tax Map 18-16, Parcel 191. The Mayor declared the public hearing open. No one spoke for or against the issue. The public hearing was closed. Motion was made by Long to approve Ordinance No. 03-634 on second reading, seconded by Driver. Passed 5-0.

Consider approval of funds transfer for various budget accounts. John Wright presented a list of budget accounts that need to be increased for this fiscal year and the accounts from which the additional funds are to be taken. Motion was made by Cordell, seconded by Long, to approve the following budget changes as presented:

Consider appointment to the Beer Board. The Mayor recommended Karl Nixon be appointed to the unexpired term of James Smith. Motion was made by Garrett to approve the appointment of Karl Nixon, seconded by Cordell. Passed 5-0.

Jim Anderson, 1216 Twelve Stones Crossing, stated he believes there is some justification for raising property taxes but that he is not in favor of tripling the rate. He encouraged the Commission to increase salaries of fire and police personnel with part of the increase in property tax revenue.

Charles Matthews, 119 Old Brick Church Pike, requested the Commission consider the following issues in his neighborhood: increase street lights, install sidewalks, provide removal of stray dogs and cats, and repair driveway entrances where they tie into the street which is 7 or 8 inches taller due to resurfacing. He would like to see severe penalties to vandals who destroy street lights.

Kim Sutton presented the Mayor with a petition from approximately 250 registered voters stating they oppose a change in the manner in which vacation and sick leave are administered for the Police and Fire Departments.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:45 p.m.
