

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: September 26, 2002

Time: 6:30 pm

Place: City Hall

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Mr. Evilcizer. Motion was made by Driver, seconded by Garrett to approve the minutes of the August 22, 2002 regular meeting. Passed 5-0.

Presentations were made to the 10 and under State Champion Girls Softball Team and the 8 and Under Goodlettsville Storm Team players and coaches for their accomplishments this season.

Consider Ordinance No. 02-626, an ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 01-606, an ordinance to regulate heavy trucks on city streets, to revise the definition of heavy truck to be any vehicle with a total number of axles greater than two. Wilson requested this item be deferred for further study.

Consider Resolution No. 02-259, a resolution in support of the proposed amendment to Article 6, Section 14 of the State Constitution, also known as "Question 2" to be on the ballot in the November 5, 2002 General Election. This amendment is related to the limit of a maximum \$50 fine in City Courts. Motion by Long to approve Resolution No. 02-259, seconded by Cordell. Passed 5-0.

Garrett complimented the Parks Department for the wonderful condition of the soccer fields.

Garrett requested a letter be sent to all the residents in Windsor Green, explaining the position of the City in the Conference Drive project, stating there is a lot of confusion among residents concerning who is responsible for the project.

Long stated Pope and Haynes are continuing to work on revisions to the alarm system ordinance and should be bringing a proposal before the Commission soon.

Long expressed appreciation to the Police Department for cleaning up the area around the bridge over Rivergate Parkway. He requested the owners of property behind Waffle House be contacted to encourage them to clean up the property or allow the City to post the property and enforce no trespassing.

DeLoach requested \$1,380 for a new heat and air unit for one of the dorms at the Fire Hall, and \$1,500 for a new power supply for the new radio system. Motion by Driver to approve these requests, seconded by Garrett. Passed 5-0.

Long encouraged everyone to vote on October 1st and wished Jones and Garrett good luck.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
