

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: June 13, 2002

Time: 6:30 pm

Place: City Hall

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jeff Cordell. Motion was made by Long, seconded by Cordell to approve the minutes of the May 23, 2002 regular meeting. Passed 5-0.

Consider approval of Ordinance No. 02-619, an ordinance to direct the Davidson County Election Commission to call an election on October 1, 2002 to fill the terms of two (2) commissioners of the City of Goodlettsville, Tennessee, pursuant to T.C.A. Section 6-20-105. Motion was made by Garrett to approve Ordinance No. 02-619 on second reading, seconded by Driver. Passed 5-0.

Consider Ordinance No. 02-620, an ordinance to change the speed limit on Main Street from 30 mph to 40 mph. Long stated he had previously suggested a 35 mph limit in a small section of Main Street, but after discussion with the Police and others, he rescinds that recommendation and supports changing to 40 mph speed limit with "strict enforcement" signs. Haynes stated there can be some question about the definition of strict enforcement and that the courts typically give some tolerance on radar so Police tend to allow 5 mph over the limit. Strictly enforced means tickets could be written at any speed over 40. Pope stated they would probably not write citations for 41 or 42 mph. Long stated he supports the change to 40 mph with the continued Police presence and enforcement. Motion by Long to approve Ordinance No. 02-620 on second reading, seconded by Garrett. Passed 5-0.

Consider Ordinance No. 02-621, an ordinance adopting a budget and establishing a property tax rate for the fiscal year July 1, 2002, through June 30, 2003. Wright stated the rate for Davidson County is \$.23 and the rate for Sumner County is \$.25. That gives an effective rate for both counties of \$.22 when you consider in the difference in the property values since the last reappraisal, and complies with the Board of Equalization's requirement that we have a uniform effective tax rate. The Mayor opened the public hearing. No one spoke for or against the ordinance. The Mayor closed the public hearing. Motion by Cordell to approve Ordinance No. 02-621 on first reading, seconded by Driver. Passed 5-0.

Consider Ordinance No. 02-622, an ordinance to amend Title 11, the official zoning map, of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code Ordinance No. 89-413, as amended by changing the zoning classification of certain property from CSI to IR - Industrial Restricted.. Terry stated the Planning Board recommends this zoning change for five parcels fronting on Connell Street beside Gibson Boat. The owners in the area will be notified of the second reading and public hearing. Motion by Long to approve Ordinance No. 02-622 on first reading, seconded by Driver. Passed 5-0.

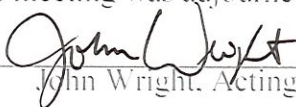
Consider Resolution No. 02-254, a resolution to enter into a lease agreement with First Source Bank for a refuse truck. Motion by Garrett to approve Resolution No. 02-254, seconded by Cordell. Passed 5-0.

Cordell stated he has received several phone calls about vandalism on cars at Indian Hills. Pope stated the Police Department has received a number of calls including an underage party incident. They are using extra patrols and investigating the incidents.

Long reported the CID patrol unit had a meth lab bust at the Motel 6. Pope stated the DEA confirmed tests were positive for meth and it appears these individuals were involved in extensive activity in Indiana.

Alsop requested approval for a \$2,000 capital expenditure for a fence for a model airplane flying area. Motion by Driver to approve this expenditure, seconded by Cordell. Passed 5-0.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:59 p.m.
