

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Johnny Long. Motion by Cordell, seconded by Long to approve the minutes of the April 11, 2002 regular meeting and the April 15, 2002 special called meeting. Passed 4-0.

Consider approval of Ordinance No. 02-617, an ordinance to enter into a new franchise agreement for cable TV between the City and Comcast Cablevision of Nashville I, LLC, second reading. Mayor Jones declared the public hearing open. No one spoke for or against the ordinance. The public hearing was closed. Motion was made by Driver to approve Ordinance No. 02-617 on second reading, seconded by Cordell. Passed 4-0.

Consider approval of Ordinance No. 02-618, an ordinance to amend Title 11, the official zoning map, of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code Ordinance No. 89-413, as amended, by changing the zoning classification from R40 to Commercial Planned Unit Development Limited for a tract of land being a part of Sumner County Tax Map 141, Parcels 7.04 and 6.01 on Springfield Highway. Mayor Jones declared the public hearing open. No one spoke for or against the ordinance. The public hearing was closed. Motion was made by Long to approve Ordinance No. 02-618 on second reading, seconded by Cordell. Passed 4-0.

Consider request of Mike Dolan to amend a City ordinance to permit more than two liquor stores in the City. Mike Dolan stated since the original ordinance limiting the number of liquor stores was passed in 1966, the population of the City has tripled in size to 15,000. Another liquor store would provide additional revenue and competition. He is interested in opening his own business and would like to provide a very nice smoke-free store. Jones state the current population is 13,281. Long noted that there have been other requests, the last being about two years ago. He stated his opinion has not changed and that he has never seen the parking lots full at the existing liquor stores and he does not feel like there is enough business to support another store. Motion was made by Long to deny the request, seconded by Cordell. Passed 4-0.

Long commended the Police Department and CID for a good job in the very successful drug raid they conducted last week.

Driver requested that consideration for changing the speed limit on Main Street from 30 mph back to 40 mph be put on the agenda for the next Commission meeting.

Lester Hardison suggested that the City look into building a walking trail out of wood chips, stating the cinders are dirty and sticks to your shoes. He also suggested if the traffic could not be slowed down on Main Street, the City might consider placing concrete barriers to protect our Senator's office.

Wilson commended Betty Freudenthal and her staff and also Mike Alsup and the Parks staff for the very successful Colonial Fair. He thanked them for all their hard work in dealing with the added problems created by the weather.

Wilson thanked the Police Department for their efforts in controlling the speeding in Moss Wright and added he has had lots of positive feedback from citizens.

At the request of Debbie Robinson, Wilson asked the Commission to participate in a Press Release on June 5 that the Second Harvest Food Bank where IBP will be announcing that they are donating twelve tons of food to the Second Harvest Food Banks across the nation.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:45 p.m.
