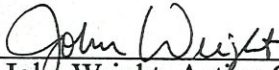


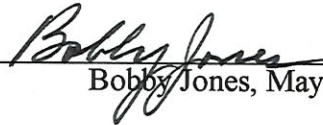
given the opportunity to do so, the staff and department heads could address and resolve whatever the issues and complaints are from Mr. Rosenburg.

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: June 14, 2001

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Johnny Long. Motion by Long, seconded by Driver to approve the minutes of the May 24, 2001 regular meeting. Passed 4-0.

Consider Ordinance No. 01-607, an ordinance of the City of Goodlettsville adopting a budget and establishing a property tax rate for the fiscal year July 1, 2001, through June 30, 2002, and public hearing of intent to exceed the certified tax rate. Mayor Jones opened the public hearing. No one spoke for or against the ordinance. The Mayor declared the public hearing closed. Motion by Driver to approve Ordinance No. 01-607 on first reading, seconded by Cordell. Passed 4-0.

Consider Ordinance No. 01-608, an ordinance to provide for fire protection requiring sprinklers in certain apartment buildings. Bill Terry stated there are currently exceptions in the building code regarding sprinklers. This ordinance would address those exceptions and require sprinklers in any three story building and all buildings with a seating capacity of 500 or more persons. Motion by Long to approve Ordinance No. 01-608 on caption on first reading, seconded by Cordell. Passed 4-0.

Mayor Jones inquired about the consideration to change the speed limit on Main Street. Deputy Chief Pope stated that Chief Hutcherson and Jack Tompkins had studied the matter and recommend changing the speed limit to 30 miles per hour from Rivergate Parkway to Dorris Street. Brasier stated he will request that the State change the signs. Mayor Jones asked that the traffic report history for this section of highway and a reply from the State regarding the signs be submitted to the Commission to consider this speed limit change by resolution.

Wilson inquired about the Rivergate Parkway signs. Brasier stated according to the contractor, the new interstate signs will be installed by August 3rd.

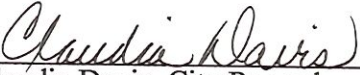
Thomas reported the Mansker Creek Clean-up project June 9th was very successful. There were approximately 100 volunteers and 10 dump truck loads of trash removed from the creeks. This was a joint effort with the City and the State Department of Environment and Conservation. He recognized Jack Tompkins and Pam Birdwell who served as the City's contact with the State and Public Works employees Lucas Smith, Roger Smith, Steve Rogers and James Lyle for the great job they did in the clean-up. The State indicated they may want to target this area again next year. Thomas and Tompkins have discussed that the City may want to organize their own clean-up.

Terry stated Nancy Sartor with the Tennessee Department of Transportation has management authority over the TEA-21 Highway Transit Act which is funding Conference Drive. She has indicated she would welcome an application from Goodlettsville for TEA-21 Enhancement Project funds for either the streetscape along Main Street or the greenway trail on the other side of the creek. He did not ask her about landscaping along the interstate exits but felt that could also be a possible request. The application must be filed by June 30th. Mayor Jones asked Terry to pursue the question about the interstate exits and report back to the Commission.

Wilson stated Jim Hitt had expressed concern about heavy trucks delivering to their business on Two Mile Pike. Many of those trucks are from out of state and it would be very difficult to forewarn every delivery driver that they would be allowed to proceed on Two Mile Pike to make a local delivery. Brasier stated the signs for "Local Deliveries Permitted" are made and will be added to the weight limit signs on Friday, June 15.

Uldrich requested a funds transfer of \$3,500 to purchase a new computer to upgrade Jim Thomas' computer and reformat his existing computer to use for the secretary's position at the Community Center. Motion by Driver to approve the funds transfer, seconded by Cordell. Passed 4-0.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:58p.m.
