

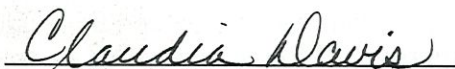
Consider Resolution No. 01-238, a resolution to enter into a contract with the Goodlettsville Area Chamber of Commerce for Tourism Marketing & Promotion. Thomas recommended deferral. Motion by Driver to defer Resolution No. 01-238, seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

Long inquired about two temporary bleachers at the soccer fields which are taking up parking spaces. Driver noted they were there for the Middle Tennessee and Vanderbilt soccer game. Alsup stated the bleachers would be moved.

Thomas stated Tompkins has been working on a new Ordinance to address the problems with certain types of vehicles on streets in residential neighborhoods. Tompkins stated this Ordinance would allow the City to prohibit heavy trucks on certain streets which are a safety hazard and are damaging to the streets. The Mayor asked Haynes if the violations fine could be increased. Haynes indicated a penalty of some kind may be allowed. He stated he would review the Ordinance and make a recommendation before the second reading. Motion by Garrett to approve Ordinance No. 01-606 on caption, seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

Wilson reported that his Mother's condition had improved from the morning but that she was being hospitalized to run additional tests.

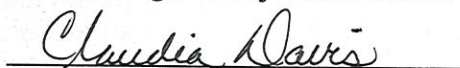
The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jerry Garrett. Motion by Cordell, seconded by Long to approve the minutes of the April 26, 2001 regular meeting. Passed 4-0.

Consider Ordinance No. 01-606, an ordinance to restrict certain vehicles on certain residential streets, and consider Resolution No. 01-240, a resolution to prohibit heavy truck traffic on Two Mile Pike. Haynes indicated he has looked over these documents but has not fully reviewed their content and form. He suggested they be considered subject to his final approval. The Mayor recommended deferral until his questions could be resolved. Motion by Garrett to defer Ordinance No. 01-606 and Resolution No. 01-240, seconded by Cordell. Passed 4-0.

Long read a Proclamation to honor our Police Department. Motion by Garrett to officially proclaim May 15 as Police Officers Memorial Day and the week of May 13th as Police Week, seconded by Long. Passed 4-0.

Wilson and Mayor Jones expressed appreciation to Jim Thomas, John Wright and all the Department Heads for the great job they did in preparing their budgets.
