

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: July 22, 1999

Time: 6:30 pm

Place: City Hall

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jim Thomas. On a motion by Long, seconded by Driver, the minutes of the July 8 regular meeting were approved by a vote of 5-0.

Consider Ordinance No. 99-581, establishing a 180-day moratorium within the City on the approval or construction of multi-family apartment developments thereby amending Title II, Chapter 4 of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code for that purpose. During the public hearing no one spoke for or against the ordinance, and the Mayor declared the public hearing closed. Bill Terry stated the Planning Board approved a recommendation to the Commission for approval of this ordinance. Motion by Garrett to approve Ordinance No. 99-581 on second reading. Seconded by Driver. Passed 5-0.

Consider Ordinance No. 99-586, for a request by Stu Phillips to establish a winery in the City of Goodlettsville. Haynes stated this ordinance approves a winery restricted to making wine, using domestic fruits, and selling the wine to the public. Long and Haynes noted liquor stores are not allowed to chill wine. Stu Phillips stated they did not plan to sell any chilled wine and customers could not open the bottles on the premises. Don O'Daniel noted winerys typically do chill wines for tasting under the requirements for that activity. Long recommended the ordinance include provisions that the wine could not be chilled. Motion by Long to approve Ordinance No. 99-586 on caption on first reading. Seconded by Thomas. Passed 5-0.

Thomas inquired about solicitors at busy intersections taking up money for non-profit organizations. Terry Hutcherson indicated the Police talk to them to verify their organization is legitimate and they do discourage this type activity due to the traffic and safety issues. Metro has an ordinance prohibiting all solicitations in public streets. Driver recommended a similar ordinance be created to enforce in both the Davidson and Sumner County portions of the City. The Mayor recommended Hutcherson, Haynes, and Wilson work on a potential ordinance to address this issue.

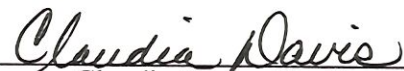
Thomas inquired if there have been any incidents recently regarding 911 calls from Metro. Hutcherson stated he was not aware of any. Wilson stated the new 911 system has been activated today in our dispatch office. Thomas recommended Jim Moore, Phillip Gibson and Phillip Uldrich report at the next Commission meeting on the new P-SAP system operation.

Thomas thanked Jack Tompkins for his quick response to a number of heat related street problems recently.

Wilson expressed the City's condolences at the death of Jim Simpson, former Assistant Police Chief.

Mike Alsup reported bids are in for a mower and they are \$300 over the budgeted amount of \$19,000. Long made a motion to approve the use of funds in the capital expenditures account for the \$300. Seconded by Garrett. Passed 5-0.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
