The meeting was called to order by Vice-Mayor Long. Prayer was offered by Jim Driver. On a motion by Thomas, seconded by Driver, the minutes of the May 13 regular meeting were approved by a vote of 4-0.

Commissioner Garrett commended those responsible for handling the logistics of the arrangements for the funeral and procession for Detective Lynn Hicks, killed in the line of duty last Saturday. Vice-Mayor Long thanked those involved from all departments for representing the City well under difficult conditions. He asked the Police Chief to head a committee to study establishing a permanent monument to honor Lynn Hicks and asked the City Manager and Purchasing Director to serve on the committee. He also requested that the City Manager send letters of thanks to all the agencies who assisted the City during the week.

The City Manager requested approval for renewal of the police software service agreement with Vision Software, Inc., at a cost of \$7799.80. The City Attorney has reviewed and approved the contract. Motion by Garrett to approve the agreement. Seconded by Thomas. Passed 4-0.

The City Manager stated that Police Officer Rick Peery had completed the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy Physical Fitness Instructor School.

Commissioner Thomas reported that the 911 Board today approved the City's request that 911 calls from Goodlettsville be routed to our dispatchers and that work continue on developing a system to send the calls to both Goodlettsville and Metro.

Commissioner Thomas read and presented a proclamation to retiring Beech High School Principal Mary Clouse recognizing her thirty years of service as teacher and principal and proclaiming May 27, 1999, as Mary Clouse Day in the City of Goodlettsville.

The meeting adjourned at 6:47 p.m.
