

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Joe Haynes. On a motion by Driver, seconded by Long, the minutes of the October 8 regular meeting were approved by a vote of 5-0.

Consider approval of Change Order 2 to Contract 2, Mansker Creek Wastewater Conveyance Facilities. The City Engineer explained that this change order is a reduction of \$23,623.05 and closes out the contract with Smith Contractors. Motion by Thomas to approve Change Order 2 to Contract 2. Seconded by Garrett. Passed 5-0.

Consider approval of Change Order 3 to Contract 1, Mansker Creek Wastewater Conveyance Facilities. The City Engineer explained that this change order is a reduction of \$5,544.52 and closes out the contract with Haren Construction Company. Motion by Driver to approve Change Order 3 to Contract 1. Seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

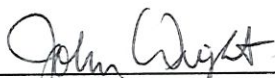

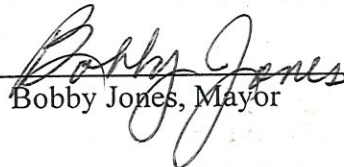
