The meeting was called to order by Vice-Mayor Long. Prayer was offered by Jim Thomas.

On a motion by Driver, seconded by Thomas, the minutes of the December 12 meeting were approved as written by a vote of 4-0.

Consider a capital expenditure for the Sewer Department. The City Engineer requested approval for the purchase of hydraulic modeling software for studying infiltration and inflow in the sewer system. Cost of the software is \$5745. Motion by Thomas to approve the purchase. Seconded by Driver. Passed 4-0.

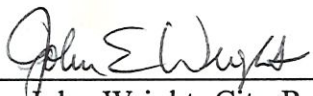
Public hearing for Law Enforcement Block Grant #96LBVX2773. The Police Chief explained that the City had received a federal block grant of \$10,209 which cannot be spent until a public hearing is held and an advisory committee is appointed and meets to decide what the grant will be used for. The plan is to use the grant for the new mounted patrol programs. The Vice-Mayor declared the public hearing open, and after no one spoke, he declared the public hearing closed.

Commissioner Thomas reported that the approval of a new Sumner County elementary school on Madison Creek Road had passed two of five steps in the process. A final decision may be made by the end of the month.

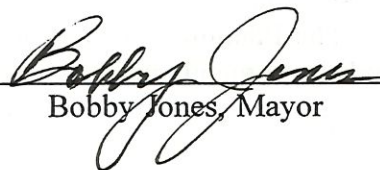
Commissioner Garrett asked about the status of street lights in the Ashlin Downs subdivision. The Public Works Director stated that most of the residents are asking for street lights, at least one resident is opposed, and discussions are continuing. He also reported that the traffic study for the light at the intersection of Dickerson Road and New Dry Creek Road has been completed and forwarded to the State. The study shows that five of six warrants for having a signal have been met. If approved by the State, the light can be installed with State Street Aid funds.

The City Manager stated that three members of the Police Department Mounted Patrol will participate in the Presidential Inaugural Parade in Washington on January 20.
