

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jim Driver.

On a motion by Long, seconded by Garrett, the minutes of the November 21 meeting were approved as written by a vote of 5-0.

Consider Resolution No. R96-177 authorizing the issuance and payment of an interest-bearing fire hall capital outlay note of \$1,000,000. The City Manager stated that the budget includes a loan from the Sewer Fund to the Capital Projects Fund to help pay for the new fire hall and that a resolution authorizing the issuance of a capital outlay note is required by and must be approved by the State Comptroller's Office. Motion by Garrett to adopt Resolution No. R96-177. Seconded by Long. Commissioner Driver asked that language be added to Section 4 to clarify that a special tax would only be authorized if existing revenue was insufficient to make payments on the note. The motion to adopt the modified resolution passed 5-0.

Stephen Smith, coach of the Hunters Lane cheerleaders, asked the commission for financial assistance in raising \$15,000 for a trip to a national cheerleading competition in Orlando in February. Scott Russell also asked for assistance in raising \$25,000 for a trip to Carnegie Hall by the Hunters Lane Madrigals in April. The Mayor stated that the commission will consider both requests and get back to them.

Commissioner Thomas thanked and commended the members of the Fire Department for the Christmas party given for underprivileged children. Doug Brown, a member of the Volunteer Fire Department, stated that over \$7000 was raised to provide the party for 50 children.

Commissioner Garrett stated that he was glad to see Safety Director Jack Hunnicutt back at the meeting after his recent surgery.

Mayor Jones asked about the status of the traffic light at Dickerson Road and Dry Creek Road. The City Manager stated that a traffic study is underway.

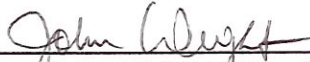
Dave Rogers of Scout Pack 200 spoke to applaud the effort of the Fire Department in having the party for the children. The Mayor opened the floor to questions from the scouts, which

included questions about the Indian village at Moss-Wright Park, the cost of the new fire hall, and the future use of the old fire hall.

The City Manager stated that he appreciated the great job done by City employees in decorating City Hall and the grounds.

He also announced that groups of employees from Dollar General Corporation in Scottsville, Kentucky, will be coming to Goodlettsville each day next week for lunch at the Pool Building, followed by a program and tour of the City, in preparation for the relocation of the company headquarters to Goodlettsville in about two years.

The meeting adjourned at 7:03 p.m.
