

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jim Driver.

On a motion by Long, seconded by Garrett, the minutes of the August 22 regular meeting were approved as written by a vote of 5-0.

The Mayor and the City Manager presented plaques to the players and coaches of the Goodlettsville Storm girls softball team which won the state ASA championship for the ten-and-under age bracket. The team presented a plaque to the Mayor in appreciation for the City's support.

Consider on second reading and public hearing Ordinance No. 96-539, to rezone from Agricultural to R15 Moncrief Avenue, Davidson County Tax Map 18, Parcels 41, 42, 43, and 54. The City Manager explained the background of the request from the property owners and the recommendation of approval from the Planning & Zoning Board for the rezoning. During the public hearing Leona Moyers asked what R15 meant, and the City Manager stated that it meant that the minimum lot area is 15,000 square feet. No one spoke for or against the ordinance, and the Mayor declared the public hearing closed. Motion by Driver to pass Ordinance No. 96-539 on second and final reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed 5-0.

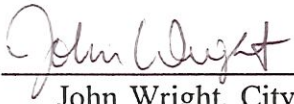
Consider on second reading and public hearing Ordinance No. 96-540, to rezone from Agricultural to R40 Matthews Estate, Springfield Highway, Sumner County Tax Map 141, Parcel 7. Commissioner Driver explained that the purpose of the rezoning was to allow the owner to subdivide the parcel into three lots so that the three houses on the parcel could be sold individually. During the public hearing no one spoke for or against the ordinance, and the Mayor declared the public hearing closed. Motion by Filson to pass Ordinance No. 96-540 on second and final reading. Seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

The Fire Chief requested approval to purchase an automatic defibrillator for \$7450. At budget time it was thought that the equipment might be furnished by Metro and was not included in the budget. The item will be purchased under the Metro contract, and training will be provided by Metro. Motion by Long to approve the purchase of the automatic defibrillator for \$7450. Seconded by Garrett. Passed 5-0.

Commissioner Garrett referred to a letter from Madison Suburban Utility District about the water line to the new fire hall and asked if the cost was known. The City Manager stated that the cost is not known but that he would find out.

Leona Moyers spoke to thank Ron Filson for sharing his time and knowledge with the community during his years of service as a commissioner.

The meeting adjourned at 6:57 p.m.
