The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jim Driver.

On a motion by Filson, seconded by Long, the minutes of the June 13 regular meeting were approved as written by a vote of 5-0.

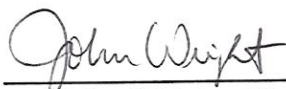
Consider on second reading and public hearing Ordinance No. 96-536, an ordinance to rezone from R25 to R15 Woodwyn Hills, Section 1, Lots 100, 101, and 102, Sumner County Tax Map 142, part of parcel 18. During the public hearing no one spoke for or against the ordinance, and the Mayor declared the public hearing closed. Motion by Driver to pass Ordinance No. 96-536 on second and final reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed 5-0.

Consider on second reading Ordinance No. 96-537, an ordinance adopting a budget and establishing a property tax rate for the fiscal year July 1, 1996, through June 30, 1997. Motion by Long to pass Ordinance No. 96-537, adopting the budget and setting the property tax rate at \$0.22/\$100.00, on second and final reading. Seconded by Garrett. Passed 5-0.

Consider on second reading Ordinance No. 96-538, an ordinance to set the date of a City election to fill three positions on the Board of Commissioners. Motion by Long to pass Ordinance No. 96-538, to set the date of the City election on Tuesday, October 1, 1996, on second and final reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed 5-0.

David Green, Jay McKinney, and Roy Lonewolf Martin addressed the commission on behalf of a group of Native Americans opposed to the construction of baseball and softball fields on the site of the current archeological excavation of an Indian village and burial sites in Moss-Wright Park. They propose reconstructing the village to preserve the historical site and attract tourists from across the country. The Mayor responded by saying that plans for the park are not definite yet and that the City is willing to listen to and work with those concerned.
