

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: September 28, 1995

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jerry Garrett.

On a motion by Filson, seconded by Long, the minutes of the September 14 regular meeting were approved as written by a vote of 5-0.

Consider on public hearing and second reading Ordinance No. 95-521, an ordinance to abandon Meadow Brook Drive as shown on the plat of Highland Heights Drive. During the public hearing Tommy Jackson and Debby Church spoke against the ordinance. As owners of properties that could be accessed by Meadow Brook Drive, they do not want any future development of their properties to be limited to access from only one direction. Bill Barton and five other residents of Highland Heights Drive spoke in favor of the ordinance. Their concern is that their street might not be as safe as it is now if traffic from future developments has access to Highland Heights Drive. George Terry spoke to express his concern about the safety of Old Dickerson Road. The Mayor declared the public hearing closed. Motion by Driver to refer the question back to the Planning & Zoning Board to consider what effect the use of Meadow Brook Drive would have on the traffic on Highland Heights Drive and Old Dickerson Road. Seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

Consider on first reading Ordinance No. 95-523, an ordinance to impose civil penalties for City of Goodlettsville code violations. Motion by Filson to pass Ordinance No. 95-523 on first reading. Seconded by Garrett. Passed 5-0.

Consider a resolution to approve a contract for an archaeological study for Moss-Wright Park Phase II. The Park Director stated that the low bidder for the study was Duvall & Associates at a cost of \$272,000 less equipment and personnel supplied by the City. Motion by Filson to adopt Resolution No. R95-154, to enter into a contract with Duvall & Associates. Seconded by Garrett. Passed 5-0.

Without objection it was agreed to consider Ordinance No. 95-517 which was not acted on at the last meeting. Motion by Garrett to defeat Ordinance No. 95-517 on second reading. Seconded by Driver. Passed 5-0.

Commissioner Driver asked the Deputy Police Chief to have police officers slow down the

traffic in the school zones.

The Mayor stated that traffic is speeding on Main Street all the time.

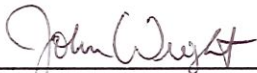
Commissioner Filson stated that he agreed with the memo from the Park Director that the tennis courts project should be contracted out instead of being done by City personnel.

He also stated that he had followed a public works department truck that had trash blowing out the back.

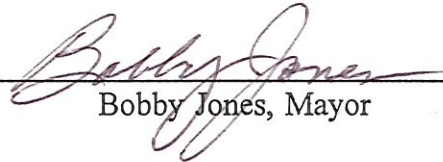
The City Manager reported that the Police Chief had contacted the property manager for the old Service Merchandise location and that they had written a letter asking the Police Department to keep tractor trailer trucks from parking on the property.

He also passed along a request from the Goodlettsville Women's Club that the City donate \$1000 to match the Club's \$1000 to be used to give \$500 to each of four high school bands if they participate in the Christmas Parade. Motion by Garrett to donate up to \$1000 to match the Goodlettsville Women's Club's donation to the bands. Seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.
