

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: April 13, 1995 Time: 6:30pm Place: City Hall

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jerry Garrett.

On a motion by Long, seconded by Driver, the minutes of the March 23 regular meeting and the March 27 special called meeting were approved as written by a vote of 5-0.

Consider on second and final reading Ordinance No. 95-512, an ordinance to approve the sale of City property in Hendersonville. The City Manager explained that a recent change in the City Manager-Commission form of government by the state legislature allows ordinances to be passed on two rather than three readings. Motion by Garrett to pass Ordinance No. 95-512 on second and final reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed 5-0.

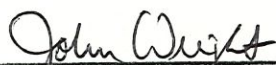
Motion by Filson to proclaim May 4, 1995, as National Day of Prayer in Goodlettsville. Seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

Commissioner Garrett asked about the status of the annexation dispute with Hendersonville. The City Attorney stated that the court injunction stopping the annexation by Goodlettsville is in effect until a hearing, but the date for the hearing has not been set.

The Park Director asked that the Commission consider the recommendations of the Park Board that Barge, Waggoner, Sumner and Cannon initiate the construction drawings for Moss-Wright Park Phase II and that DuVall and Associates initiate the archaeological study of Moss-Wright Park Phase II. The proposal from Barge, Waggoner is for \$46,500, and the estimate from DuVall is for \$250,000 if they do all the work to a lesser amount if volunteers and City personnel are used. The commissioners asked that a more definite cost for the archaeological work be determined. Motion by Garrett to authorize Barge, Waggoner to proceed with the engineering for Moss-Wright Park Phase II. Seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

The City Manager stated that at the request of the Sumner County Law Director he would be writing a letter to Governor Sundquist to thank him for his commitment to the Vietnam Veterans Boulevard Extension to the Highway 109 By-Pass in Gallatin.

The meeting adjourned at 6:54 p.m.
