

MINUTES OF SPECIAL CALLED MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: December 21, 1994

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Ron Filson.

On a motion by Long, seconded by Driver, the minutes of the December 8 regular meeting were approved as written by a vote of 5-0.

Consider the request of Scott Haynes on behalf of Bailey's Sports Bar, Inc., to amend the city code regarding operation of pool and billiard establishments. The City Manager stated that the current ordinance prohibits the serving of alcoholic beverages in any pool or billiard establishment and requires such businesses to close at midnight. Scott Haynes and Pat Boyd spoke to request that the prohibition against alcoholic beverages be lifted and that the closing hour be changed to 3:00 a.m. Motion by Driver to pass on caption on first reading an ordinance to remove the restriction on serving alcoholic beverages in pool or billiard establishments. Seconded by Garrett. Passed 5-0. 94-504

Oval Sullins, owner of Rivergate Gameland stated that the midnight closing requirement hurts his business, and he requested that the closing time be extended past midnight.

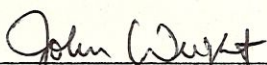
The Police Chief stated that there has not been much trouble at the Gameland location and that the state curfew law is midnight for persons under the age of 18.

Consider an appropriation to fund a golf course market demand/feasibility analysis for the City of Goodlettsville. The City Manager stated that in the past few years several groups have expressed interest in building a golf course in the City. Commissioner Driver stated that interest still exists even though Springfield is currently building a new course. Motion by Driver to authorize the expenditure of \$6000 plus reasonable travel expenses to do a market demand/feasibility analysis. Seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

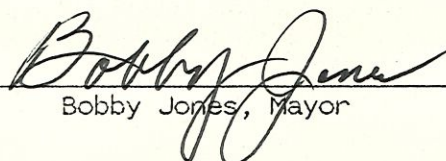
Commissioner Garrett asked about the status of the internship. The City Manager stated that he had met with the graduate student interested in doing a project to input information about the City into the state Economic Development System, with work to begin in February and last for six months. The amount of compensation has not been agreed on.

Commissioner Filson stated that he wanted to go on record as saying that the City Manager and city employees are doing a good job and that he is proud of the work that they do.
