

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jerry Garrett.

On a motion by Driver, seconded by Long, the minutes of the August 25 regular meeting were approved as written by a vote of 5-0.

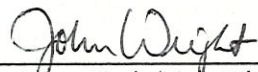
Consider on second reading Ordinance No. 94-501, an ordinance to abandon the undeveloped street right-of-way designated as Donna Drive which lies between Lots 20 and 24 on Elba Drive, Page Heights Subdivision, Section 1, Sumner County Tax Map 143-J, Group C, Parcels 34 and 35. The City Manager stated that the public hearing will be held on third reading since the newspaper failed to publish the notice of public hearing in time for this meeting. Motion by Garrett to pass Ordinance No. 94-501 on second reading. Seconded by Driver. Commissioner Long asked about the utility easement across the property. The Planning Director stated that the Nashville Electric Service easement is being retained. Motion passed 5-0.

Consider on third reading Ordinance No. 94-502, an ordinance to enter into a contract with Tennessee Department of Transportation for construction of sidewalks on Long Hollow Pike from I-65 to Dickerson Road. Motion by Long to pass Ordinance No. 94-502 on third reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed 5-0.

Commissioner Garrett reported on four requests that he had received from citizens for future consideration by the Commission: (1) Pete Prater would like to form a committee to organize some type of recognition of those involved in the restoration of the Bowen-Campbell House on the 20th anniversary of that project; (2) residents on McCoin Drive are having trouble getting Nashville Gas Company to extend service to their street and would like assistance from the City in getting that done; (3) residents on Two Mile Pike would like to see sidewalks installed on at least one side of the street; and (4) people have complained about the 30 mph speed limit on New Dry Creek Road being too low.

The City Manager announced that the retirement dinner for Nancy Allen would be held on September 21.

The meeting adjourned at 6:44 p.m.
