

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Jim Driver.

On a motion by Driver, seconded by Long, the minutes of the September 9 regular meeting were approved as written by a vote of 5-0.

Ordinance No. 93-486, an ordinance to amend Title 2, Chapter 2 of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code regarding the sale of beer, to comply with 1993 Public Acts, Chapter 297, which amends TCA Title 57, Chapter 4, Part 1. Third reading. Motion by Long to pass on third reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed 5-0.

Ordinance No. 93-481, an ordinance to abandon a sewer easement on Church Street. Third reading. Deferred until completion of the project to relocate the sewer line.

Consider a resolution to amend the City Personnel Policies & Procedures Manual to comply with the Family & Medical Leave Act of 1993 and to reflect changes in employee longevity pay and Deferred Compensation Plan. Deferred until exact wording of the changes are completed.

Consider appointment to fill a vacancy on the Planning Board. The Mayor asked for suggestions before the next meeting to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of Sonny Ponder.

Margaret Wall, a resident of the City, said, "You're doing a great job."

The City Manager stated that the City Attorney had determined that the appointment of the Mansker Foundation as an advisory board to the commission needs to be done by ordinance instead of by resolution. Motion by Filson to adopt such an ordinance on caption on first reading. (Ordinance No. 93-487) Seconded by Garrett. Passed 5-0.

The City Manager also stated the portion of Peay Park proposed to be swapped with the Masonic Lodge is zoned residential and needs to be rezoned commercial. Motion by Garrett to pass an ordinance on caption on first reading to rezone the property to commercial (Ordinance No. 93-488) and to refer the matter to the Planning & Zoning Board to approve the subdivision of the portion to be rezoned. Seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

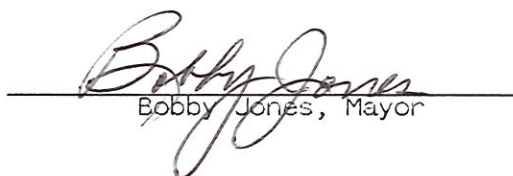

Commissioner Long asked about the traffic light at Bluebird and Two Mile Parkway. The Public Works Director stated that he had met with Metro Public Works officials. The City will have to make an official request to Metro for the light to be changed since the entire light will have to be replaced.

The meeting adjourned at 6:43 p.m.
