

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: May 27, 1993

Time: 6:30pm

Place: City Hall

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jones. Prayer was offered by Mike Alsup.

On a motion by Long, seconded by Driver, the minutes of the May 13 regular meeting were approved as written by a vote of 5-0.

Ordinance No. 93-477, an ordinance of the City of Goodlettsville adopting a budget and establishing a property tax rate for the fiscal year July 1, 1993, through June 30, 1994. Second reading. Motion by Garrett to amend the ordinance to set the Sumner County property tax rate to be the same as the certified rate for Davidson County, whatever that rate is determined to be. The motion to amend died for lack of a second. Motion by Long to pass Ordinance No. 93-477 on second reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed 4-1, with Jones, Long, Filson, and Driver voting yes and Garrett voting no.

Ordinance No. 93-478, an ordinance to authorize the City of Goodlettsville to enter into a contract with Barge, Waggoner, Sumner & Cannon for engineering services for the Mansker Creek Sewer Project. Second reading. The City Attorney stated that he had reviewed the contract with Hendersonville Utility District but had not seen the one with Metro yet, and he recommended that the ordinance be passed on second reading but not put back on the agenda for third reading until both those contracts had been executed. Motion by Driver to pass Ordinance No. 93-478 on second reading. Seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

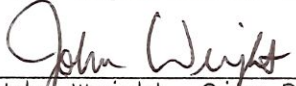
Ordinance No. 93-479, an ordinance to amend Title 8, Chapter 3, Section 8-308, of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code, by adding or changing various provisions relating to abatement of conditions of excessive weeds, grass, litter and other conditions. Second reading. Motion by Garrett to pass on second reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed 5-0.

Consider the recommendation of the Planning & Zoning Board to abandon a portion of an alley off Lindberg Avenue, Davidson County Tax Map 18-16, at the rear of Parcels 98 and 99 facing North Dickerson Road; Parcels 106, 107, and 108 facing Bass Street; and Parcels 109.1 and 110 facing Depot Street. The Planning Director explained that the request came from the property owners of the parcels involved who are currently using portions of the alley as parts of their property. Since their use of the alley is inconsistent with the normal division of the alley if abandoned by the City, he recommended that this item be deferred until he can meet with the property owners to discuss the situation. Motion by Long to defer action. Seconded by Filson. Passed 5-0.

Consider a resolution regarding the employee deferred compensation plan. The City Manager explained that a state law passed in 1992 allows the City to contribute to the deferred compensation plan as well as to the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System, which would be an additional benefit to participating employees. Motion by Filson to adopt Resolution No. R93-128, an application to the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System for permission to contribute to the deferred compensation plan for the City of Goodlettsville. Seconded by Long. Passed 5-0.

Commissioner Long asked if any action had been taken with regard to widening of the railroad underpass. The City Manager stated that he had not yet made contact with the State or the railroad but that he would do so.

The meeting adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
