

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: August 13, 1992

Time: 6:30pm

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Garrett. Prayer was offered by Jim Driver. Motion by Jones to approve the minutes of the July 23 regular meeting. Seconded by Long and passed 4-0.

Doug Hardcastle of Hardcastle Construction Company spoke to the Commission to ask why his company had been sued for the damage to Northgate Circle caused by heavily loaded trucks without anyone from the City ever contacting him or someone from his company. He also asked that the City drop the suit since his company was not at fault. The Mayor stated that his comments and request would be taken under consideration by the Commission and the City Attorney.

Ordinance No. 92-462, an ordinance to amend Goodlettsville Municipal Code, Title 8, Chapter 2, "Refuse", by adding a new Section 8-215 to regulate the hours for emptying or removing containers used for the accumulation or handling of garbage. Public hearing and second reading. During the public hearing David Lewis, a resident of Highland Heights Drive, stated that he was awakened every Tuesday morning at 5:00 a.m. by a truck emptying a dumpster near his home and is in favor of the ordinance. No one spoke against the ordinance, and the Mayor declared the public hearing closed. Motion by Driver to pass Ordinance No. 92-462 on second reading. Seconded by Jones. Passed 4-0.

Ordinance No. 92-463, an ordinance to abandon the right-of-way of the remaining portion of Central Avenue, north of Dickerson Road. Second reading. Motion by Long to pass Ordinance No. 92-463 on second reading. Seconded by Driver. Passed 4-0.

Ordinance No. 92-464, an ordinance to annex Parcels 128 and 130, Sumner County Tax Map 121, into the City limits. Public hearing and second reading. During the public hearing no one spoke for or against the ordinance, and the Mayor declared the public hearing closed. Motion by Jones to pass Ordinance No. 92-464 on second reading. Seconded by Long. Passed 4-0.

Ordinance No. 92-465, an ordinance to approve a contract with the State to reimburse the City for the relocation of sewer lines required by the widening of Long Hollow Pike. Second reading. Motion by Long to pass Ordinance No. 92-465 on second reading. Seconded by Jones. Passed 4-0.

Consider the City Attorney's Opinion with regard to the enforcement of park rules. Russell Freeman summarized the letter from City Attorney Joe Haynes to

Park Director Mike Alsup in which he stated that the City has the power to enforce the park ordinance through police officers or designated employees. The proposed changes to the park ordinance will be put on the agenda for consideration at the next meeting.

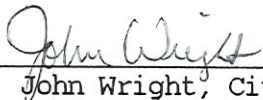
Commissioner Driver expressed his sympathy to Jerry Ann Filson in the death of her brother Gene Moore and to his mother Mrs. Ophelia Moore. The Mayor asked that the City Manager send letters of sympathy to Mrs. Filson and Mrs. Moore on behalf of the Commission.

Commissioner Long asked if any contact had been made with the Masonic Lodge concerning the acquisition of their property for the new fire hall. The City Manager stated that no official action had been taken but that he had talked to members of the Lodge about it.

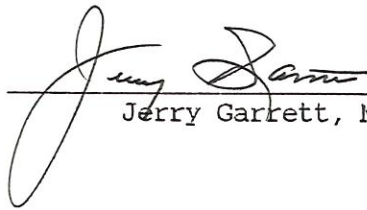
The City Manager requested that the commission pass on first reading an ordinance to approve a contract with the State to reimburse the City up to \$6000 for the cost of the Planning Director's participation in the Metropolitan Planning Organization. Motion by Jones to pass Ordinance No. 92-466 on caption on first reading. Seconded by Driver. Passed 4-0.

The City Manager reported that he had talked on the telephone today with two Aldermen from the City of Hendersonville about the lawsuit they filed to invalidate the purchase of land in Hendersonville by the City of Goodlettsville. He told them, and he wanted to state for the record, that, contrary to published statements by the Mayor of Hendersonville that the lawsuit was filed because representatives of the City of Goodlettsville would not meet with him about the land purchase, there had in fact been a meeting between the five Goodlettsville commissioners and the Hendersonville Mayor and City Planner. In addition, an invitation by the City of Goodlettsville for a second meeting which would also include the Hendersonville Vice-mayor was rejected by the Mayor.

The meeting adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
