

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: June 25, 1992

Time: 6:30pm

Place: City Hall

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Garrett. Prayer was offered by Jim Driver. Motion by Jones to approve the minutes of the June 11 regular meeting. Seconded by Long and passed 5-0.

Ordinance No. 90-459, an ordinance of the City of Goodlettsville adopting a budget and establishing a property tax rate for fiscal year July 1, 1992, through June 30, 1993. Third reading. Because the budget has not been finalized, this item was deferred to a special called meeting on a motion by Long, seconded by Driver, and passed by a vote of 5-0. The finance director explained the need to amend the ordinance on third reading to set separate tax rates for the Sumner and Davidson County portions of the City due to the reappraisal of Sumner County and the determination by the State Board of Equalization that the certified rates are \$.22 for Davidson and \$.17 for Sumner County.

Ordinance No. 92-461, an ordinance to direct the Davidson County Election Commission to call an election to fill the terms of three (3) Commissioners of the City of Goodlettsville, Tennessee, pursuant to T.C.A. Section 6-20-105. Second reading. Motion by Jones to pass Ordinance No. 92-461 on second reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed 5-0.

Consider an ordinance to amend Goodlettsville Municipal Code, Title 8 (Health & Sanitation), Chapter 2 (Refuse), by adding a new Section (8-215) to regulate the hours for emptying or removing containers used for the accumulation or handling of garbage or rubbish when said containers are located near buildings or structures used for residential purposes. The Vice-Mayor and City Manager explained that they had received numerous complaints from citizens about the noise associated with the emptying of commercial dumpsters very early in the morning. This ordinance would prohibit such activity before 7:00 a.m. Motion by Driver to pass Ordinance No. 92-462 on first reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed 5-0.

The Mayor appointed Edgar Lowe to the vacancy on the Board of Zoning Appeals. An appointment to the vacancy on the Planning & Zoning Board was deferred to the next regular meeting.

A response to the request of a property owner north of the city limits that the City extend its sewer line to serve his property was deferred until the city engineer could study the request further.

On a motion by Long, seconded by Jones, and passed 5-0, the appropriation for the Police Vehicles Fuel Account (421-264) was increased by \$4000 and the Police Court Overtime Account (421-113) was decreased by \$4000.

Commissioner Filson asked about the status of the 911 program. The City Manager stated that he is writing a letter to the Metro 911 Board to let them know that we are ready for them to go ahead and install the system.

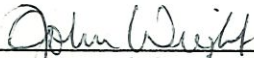
Filson also asked about the conversion of the officials parking lot at the Quad in Moss-Wright Park to a senior citizens parking lot. The change will be made next year.

Commissioner Long asked that the City start discussions with the Masonic Lodge about acquiring their property so that a new fire hall can be constructed on Memorial Drive at some point in the future. Jones seconded his motion to that effect and it passed 5-0.

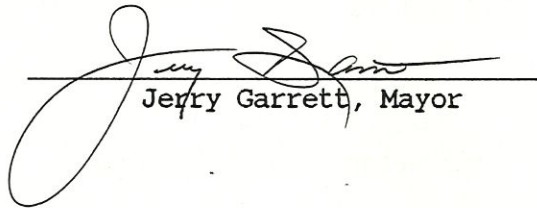
Commissioner Filson reported that he had received a request from a citizen regarding the abandonment of a portion of the right-of-way on Payne Street.

The Mayor answered some of the questions and referred the others to the City Attorney, who stated that he would be glad to talk with Mr. Clary after the meeting adjourned.
