

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: January 23, 1992

Time: 6:30pm

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Garrett. Prayer was offered by Mike Alsup. Motion by Long to approve the minutes of the January 9 regular meeting. Seconded by Jones and passed unanimously.

Hear Jim and Mary Binkley with regard to problems with handicap parking in the City. Mary Binkley spoke on behalf of her husband Jim, who is handicapped as the result of a stroke. She stated that there are not enough handicap parking spaces at Rivergate Mall and other locations, that the spaces are sometimes too far from the entrances, and that the spaces are being used by people who are not handicapped. The Planning Director and Police Chief will investigate the complaints and report back to the commission at the next meeting.

Consider request from E-911 to officially designate Dickerson Road, from Shevel to Dorris Avenue, as Main Street in order to more efficiently respond to emergency calls. The City Manager asked that this item be deferred for more study. Motion by Filson to defer indefinitely. Seconded by Long and passed unanimously.

Commissioner Filson asked that the monthly commissioner lunches be reinstated beginning on the fourth Friday of February at noon and that employees and citizens be informed that the commissioners will be available then to discuss any issue.

Mayor Garrett announced the death of Rosa Willis, Goodlettsville's first librarian, and asked that the City write a letter to the family recognizing her years of service to the community.

Commissioner Childers asked that special requests from any department, especially involving the expenditure of funds, be made well in advance so that adequate consideration can be given before a decision must be made.

Walter Todd, representing the Hunters Lane High School Athletic Association, requested help from the City, in the form of equipment and personnel, in preparing its baseball field for use this spring. The Mayor stated that it has always been the City's policy to assist the schools whenever possible but that employees can be used only on a voluntary basis.

The meeting adjourned at 6:53pm.
