He also reported that the plans to widen Long Hollow Pike are complete and the State is beginning to acquire rights-of-way with funding for construction probable in the 1992-1993 State Budget. The Public Works Director stated that current plans call for five lanes from Caldwell Road to Madison Creek Road, sidewalks from Caldwell to Grace Drive, and a traffic light at Loretta Drive.

Bill Terry explained that the purpose of the ordinance is to reduce the tax burden on the property owner since the commercial development proposed for the property failed to materialize.
