

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: March 14, 1991

Time: 6:30pm

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Garrett. Prayer was offered by Bobby Jones. Minutes of the February 28 regular meeting and the March 8 special called meeting were approved as written.

Ordinance No. 91-442, an ordinance to amend the Sewer Use Ordinance No. 82-283, Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 13, Chapter 2, Sections 13-201, 13-203, and 13-204. Third reading. Motion by Childers to pass Ordinance No. 91-442 on third reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 91-443, an ordinance to amend the Standard Building Code Ordinance No. 86-348, as amended, Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 4, Chapter 4, by adding various provisions. Third reading. Motion by Filson to pass Ordinance No. 91-443 on third reading. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 91-444, an ordinance to enter into a contract with White House Utility District for the billing and collection of sewer fees in the Sumner County portion of the City. Third reading. Motion by Filson to pass Ordinance No. 91-444 on third reading. Seconded by Childers. At the suggestion of the City Attorney, motion by Filson to amend the ordinance to take effect immediately instead of fifteen days after passage. Seconded by Childers. Amendment passed unanimously. The amended Ordinance No. 91-444 passed unanimously on third reading.

Consider an ordinance to permit employees to perform work for the City on off-duty hours as private contractors or business owners under certain conditions. The City Attorney explained that state law prohibits city officials from contracting with the City and that the Goodlettsville Municipal Code Section 1-1001 prohibits city officials and employees from having business dealings with the City. Motion by Childers, seconded by Long, to pass an ordinance on caption to allow employees to perform work for the City. The City Manager pointed out that Ordinance No. 90-432, which has already passed two readings and had been deferred for further study, amends Section 1-1001 to remove the prohibition against city employees having business dealings with the City. The original motion and second were withdrawn. Motion by Childers to pass Ordinance No. 90-432 on third reading. Seconded by Long. Passed unanimously.

Police Chief Schott and Assistant Fire Chief Gibson reported on the Hazardous Materials Training Exercise conducted today. The simulated tanker spill and evacuation situation, compounded by an actual house fire, was considered to be a valuable training experience for the police and fire departments.

Motion by Long to approve Corporate Authorization Resolution for the Bank of Goodlettsville designating four individuals authorized to sign checks for the General Fund and Sewer Fund. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

It is good to have corporate citizens such as your company who are willing to provide such benefits to the community.

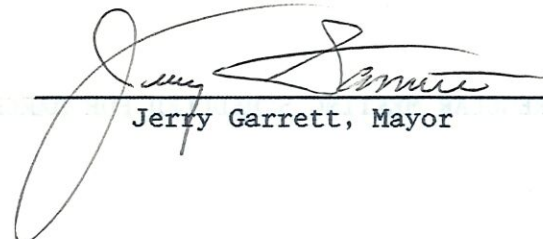
