

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Garrett. Prayer was offered by Bobby Jones. Minutes of the February 14 meeting were approved as written.

Ordinance No. 91-442, an ordinance to amend the Sewer Use Ordinance No. 82-283, Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 13, Chapter 2, Sections 13-201, 13-203, and 13-204. Second reading. Motion by Filson to pass Ordinance No. 91-442 on second reading. Seconded by Long. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 91-443, an ordinance to amend the Standard Building Code Ordinance No. 86-348, as amended, Goodlettsville Municipal Code Title 4, Chapter 4, by adding various provisions. Second reading. Motion by Jones to pass Ordinance No. 91-443 on second reading. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 91-444, an ordinance to enter into a contract with White House Utility District for the billing and collection of sewer fees in the Sumner County portion of the City. Second reading. Motion by Long to pass Ordinance No. 91-444 on second reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed unanimously.

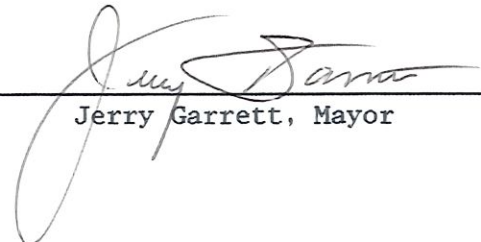
The Mayor appointed Mary Ann Gourley to the Industrial Development Board and Walter Todd to the Hearing Authority. He also appointed Jim Denton, Monte Goostree, and Tommy DeLoach to the Bicentennial Project Committee and Jean Renfro (Chairperson), Glen Freudenthal, Anne T. Garrett, Pam Garrett, Roy Upton, and Ron Filson to the Mansker Foundation study committee.

The City Manager requested that the requirement for sealed bids be waived for the restoration work needed at the Bowen-Campbell House due to the specialized nature of the work. He also reported that proposals had been received from four firms and recommended that the Leatherwood, Inc. proposal of \$36,374 be accepted. Motion by Filson to waive sealed bids and accept the Leatherwood proposal subject to approval of the waiver process by the City Attorney. The motion died for lack of a second when concern was expressed that more time was needed to study the proposals. Because work needs to begin as soon as possible it was decided to consider this question at a called meeting on Friday, March 8.

The meeting adjourned at 6:55pm.
