

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: December 13, 1990

Time: 6:30pm

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Garrett. Prayer was offered by Johnny Long. Minutes of the November 8 regular meeting and the November 12 special called meeting were approved as written.

Park Director Mike Alsup and Commissioner Ron Filson presented plaques to the members of the Dixie Youth Baseball 15-16 year-old state championship team and the Girls Softball 6-8 year-old and 16-19 year-old state championship teams.

Andy Dyer, on behalf of the Goodlettsville Girls Softball League, presented a plaque to the City in appreciation of its support for recreation programs in Goodlettsville.

Pam Garrett, newly elected president of the Goodlettsville Area Chamber of Commerce, spoke to thank the City for its support of the Chamber in the past and of her hope for a continued good working relationship in the future.

Ordinance No. 90-437, an ordinance to amend Title 11, Chapter 5, of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code (Zoning Ordinance No. 89-413, as amended) to rezone Parcel 3, Sumner County Tax Map 142 from CG (Commercial General) to IG (Industrial General). Third reading. Motion by Long to pass on third reading. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 90-439, an ordinance to amend Title 14, Chapter 1 of the Goodlettsville Municipal Code (Sign Ordinance No. 87-386), Sections 14-103 3.1(i), 14-103 3.5(a), 14-105 5.1(e)(3), 14-105 5.2(b)(2), and 14-107 7.2, by deleting some provisions and adding other provisions. First reading. Planning Director Bill Terry explained the proposed changes to the sign ordinance. Motion by Filson to pass on first reading. Seconded by Long. Passed unanimously.

Consider an ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 70-120, as amended, (Municipal Code Title 13, Chapter 1, Section 13-106), being an ordinance establishing a schedule of rates to be charged for sewer services to be supplied by the sewer system of the City of Goodlettsville, and establishing rules and regulations for the operation thereof by inserting a new Schedule 3 in Section 1 of said ordinance, being a new schedule of rates. First reading (Ordinance No. 90-440). The City Manager explained that the rate increase is necessary to comply with the provisions of the contract with Metro which requires the City to raise its rates to match Metro's rates. Metro will raise its rates by six percent on January 1, 1991, and again on January 1 of 1992 and 1993. Commissioner Bobby Jones

requested that the ordinance include the reasons for the rate increase, and the City Attorney stated that it would. Motion by Jones to pass Ordinance No. 90-440 on first reading. Seconded by Filson. Passed unanimously.

Consider approval of a 25-mile per hour speed limit in Windsor Green P.U.D. Grayson Cannon, speaking on behalf of the Windsor Green Homeowners Association, requested that the speed limit be raised from 20 to 25 miles per hour and that signs be posted throughout the subdivision. She also requested that No Parking signs be posted to prevent parking along Windsor Trace, the main loop road. Motion by Filson to establish the speed limit at 25 miles per hour. Seconded by Long. Passed unanimously. The Mayor asked the Public Works Director to install new speed limit signs as soon as possible and asked that the staff study and make recommendations regarding the No Parking signs.

Patty Gunn, a resident of Draper Circle, spoke to thank the City and Ron Filson for the trees that were planted as a screen between I-65 and several homes on Draper Circle. Commissioner Filson commended Tommy DeLoach and Jerry Grisham for their work on installing the trees.

The Mayor read a list of board members whose terms are expiring at the end of the year and asked for input from the other commissioners before making appointments at the next meeting.

Consider establishing a policy governing the use of Massie Auditorium and the Gazebo Park at City Hall. The City Manager explained that requests for the use of the auditorium and gazebos are increasing and recommended that a committee be appointed to develop rules and guidelines for their usage. The Mayor stated that he would appoint a committee to study the problem and make recommendations to the commission.

Consider a request of the Historical & Arts Council to support their efforts to establish a community choir. Rob Wheeler, on behalf of the Historical & Arts Council, explained that he has made contact with several individuals in the City about starting a choir and requested that \$500 be appropriated to help get the program going. Motion by Filson to approve the request for \$500. Seconded by Jones. Passed unanimously.

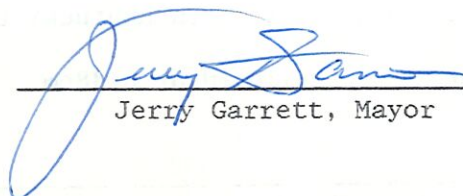
The City Manager requested that the commission approve the new Park Board Rules and Regulations that are to be effective January 1. Motion by Jones to approve the new rules subject to the removal of fees for Senior Citizens (age 55 or over). Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

The City Manager asked that an ordinance be passed on caption on first reading to establish \$2500 as the minimum amount of purchase for which sealed bids must be taken. That is the amount which is currently used but has not been set by ordinance as required by state law. Motion by Long to pass such an ordinance (No. 90-441) on caption on first reading. Seconded by Childers. Passed unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 7:24pm.
